1.2 **Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Turkey Special Hunt Quotas**

1.3 **6236.1060 TURKEY HUNT QUOTAS.**

1.4 [For text of subp 1, see 33 SR 914]

1.5 Subp. 2. Permits for disability hunts.

1.6 A. For wild turkey permit area 337, two additional permits per time period
1.7 are available for individuals with disabilities participating in a special hunt on the
1.8 Minnesota Valley National Wildlife Refuge. Capable Partners is the sponsoring nonprofit
1.9 organization.

1.10 B. For wild turkey permit area 223, one additional permit per time period is
1.11 available for individuals with disabilities participating in a special hunt on the Sand Prairie
1.12 Wildlife Management Area. Capable Partners is the sponsoring nonprofit organization.

1.13 C. For wild turkey permit area 225, three additional permits per time period are
1.14 available for individuals with disabilities participating in a special hunt on the Becklin
1.15 Homestead Park Wildlife Management Area. Capable Partners and the Isanti County
1.16 Sportsman's Club are the sponsoring nonprofit organizations.

1.17 D. For Camp Ripley Military Reservation, within wild turkey permit area 248,
1.18 up to an additional 60 permits shall be issued for April 21-23. One nonhunting mentor
1.19 must accompany each disabled hunter. The St. Cloud Veterans Administration is the
1.20 sponsoring organization.

1.21 E. For wild turkey permit area 424, one additional permit for each of time
1.22 periods A, B, and D is available for individuals with disabilities participating in a special
1.23 hunt on the Claire Rollings (East Unit) Wildlife Management Area. Within the East
1.24 Unit, the area east of the Chippewa River is closed to general draw permit holders during
1.25 seasons A to D. The entire Claire Rollings (East Unit) Wildlife Management Area is open

2.1 to general draw permit holders during seasons E to H. Claire Rollings (West Unit) and
2.2 Claire Rollings (Rhode Tract) are open to general draw permit holders during all time
2.3 periods. Midwest Outdoors Unlimited is the sponsoring nonprofit organization.

2.4 F. For wild turkey permit area 467, 12 additional permits are available during
2.5 time period C and 12 additional permits are available during time period G for individuals
2.6 with disabilities participating in a special hunt at Ironwood Springs Christian Ranch.
2.7 National Wild Turkey Federation's Wheelin' Sportsmen is the sponsoring nonprofit
2.8 organization.

2.9 **6236.1070 YOUTH WILD TURKEY SPECIAL HUNTS.**

2.10 Subpart 1. **Requirements.** Persons participating in youth wild turkey hunts must be
2.11 at least 12 years of age and under 18 years of age by the beginning hunt date. A valid
2.12 wild turkey license and firearms safety certificate must be obtained prior to being issued
2.13 a permit. Youth participating in these hunts must not have previously drawn a turkey
2.14 permit. All participants must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian who is at least
2.15 18 years of age. The accompanying parent or guardian may not ~~hunt~~ be armed, but may
2.16 assist during the hunt. All participants and their accompanying parent or guardian must
2.17 attend a prehunt orientation offered by the hunt sponsors. Participating youth hunters must
2.18 be sponsored and selected by a sponsoring nonprofit or selected by lottery.

2.19 Subp. 2. **Open areas.** Youth hunt permittees may hunt in open areas and special
2.20 seasons as designated by the commissioner. In 2009, the following areas are open for
2.21 youth wild turkey hunters by permit:

2.22 A. the Wildlife Science Center property and adjoining private property in Anoka
2.23 County in wild turkey permit area 227 is open for taking wild turkeys April 18 and 19,
2.24 April 25 and 26, May 2 and 3, May 9 and 10, and May 16 and 17. No more than 25
2.25 additional permits shall be issued to first-time turkey hunters ages 12 to 17 selected by the

3.1 Wildlife Science Center. No more than five permits shall be issued per open time period.
3.2 The Wildlife Science Center is the sponsoring nonprofit organization;

3.3 B. Wilder Forest in Washington County in wild turkey permit area 236 is open
3.4 for taking wild turkeys April 18 and 19, April 25 and 26, May 2 and 3, May 9 and 10,
3.5 and May 16 and 17. No more than 50 additional permits cumulatively shall be issued
3.6 to hunters ages 12 to 17 selected by the John Glenn Archery Club and the Safari Club
3.7 International North Country Cadets. No more than ten permits shall be issued per open
3.8 time period to hunters ages 12 to 17 selected by the John Glenn Archery Club. The John
3.9 Glenn Archery Club and the Safari Club International North Country Cadets are the
3.10 sponsoring nonprofit organizations;

3.11 C. the St. Croix Research Station, Warner Nature Center, and Boy Scouts of
3.12 America Camp Kiwanis in wild turkey permit area 236 are open for taking wild turkeys
3.13 by archery April 18 and 19, April 25 and 26, and May 2 and 3. No more than seven
3.14 additional permits shall be issued per open time period to hunters ages 12 to 17 selected by
3.15 the Bucks and Buckthorn Club. The Bucks and Buckthorn Club and the Science Museum
3.16 of Minnesota are the sponsoring nonprofit organizations;

3.17 D. the Minnesota Valley State Recreation Area in Scott and Carver Counties,
3.18 the Minnesota Valley National Wildlife Refuge in Scott and Carver Counties, and private
3.19 property identified by the hunt sponsor in turkey permit areas 338A, 442A, and 601A
3.20 within Scott, Carver, Dakota, and Rice Counties are open April 18 and 19 for taking wild
3.21 turkeys from one-half hour before sunrise until noon each day. No more than 23 additional
3.22 permits shall be issued to first-time turkey hunters ages 12 to 17 selected by lottery. The
3.23 National Wild Turkey Federation is the sponsoring nonprofit organization;

3.24 E. Chester Woods Park in Olmsted County is open April 11 and 12 and April 18
3.25 and 19 for taking wild turkeys from one-half hour before sunrise until noon each day. No
3.26 more than 30 additional permits shall be offered to first-time turkey hunters ages 12 to 17

4.1 selected by lottery. No more than 15 permits shall be offered per open time period. The
 4.2 National Wild Turkey Federation is the sponsoring nonprofit organization;

4.3 F. private property identified by the hunt sponsor in the following wild turkey
 4.4 permit areas is open from one-half hour before sunrise until noon on April 18 and 19. No
 4.5 more than the following additional permits shall be issued to first-time turkey hunters ages
 4.6 12 to 17 selected by lottery. The National Wild Turkey Federation is the sponsoring
 4.7 nonprofit organization:

5.15 G. for wild turkey permit area 601A, 14 additional permits are authorized for
5.16 youth participating in a hunt conducted by the National Wild Turkey Federation May
5.17 16 and 17.

5.18 **6236.1075 SPECIAL HUNTS FOR MILITARY PERSONNEL.**

5.19 A. For Camp Ripley Military Reservation, within wild turkey permit area
5.20 248, up to an additional 60 permits shall be issued for April 25 to 29, 2009, for taking
5.21 bearded turkey using legal shotguns, muzzleloading shotguns, or archery equipment. The
5.22 Minnesota Army National Guard is the sponsoring organization.

5.23 B. For Arden Hills Army Training Site, within wild turkey permit area 601, up
5.24 to an additional 20 permits shall be issued for April 15 to 19, 2009, and April 20 to 24,
5.25 2009 (ten for each five days), for taking bearded turkey using legal archery equipment.
5.26 The Minnesota Army National Guard is the sponsoring organization.

- 6.1 **EFFECTIVE PERIOD.** The emergency amendments to Minnesota Rules, part
6.2 6236.1070, expire July 1, 2009. Minnesota Rules, parts 6236.1060 and 6236.1075, expire
6.3 July 1, 2009.
