1.2 **Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Camp Ripley Archery Hunt**  
1.3 **and Youth Special Deer Hunts and Seasons**

1.4 **6232.0900 CAMP RIPLEY ARCHERY HUNT.**

1.5 [For text of subps 1 and 2, see M.R.]

1.6 Subp. 3. **Antlerless deer and legal bucks.** In 2010, Camp Ripley is open for taking  
1.7 antlerless deer and legal bucks. Not more than 2,500 permits shall be issued for each  
1.8 two-day hunting period.

1.9 Subp. 4. **Bag limits.** The bag limit for the Camp Ripley archery hunt is two deer.  
1.10 Hunters may use bonus permits to take antlerless deer and may take a deer of either sex on  
1.11 a regular license. Only one legal buck may be taken during this hunt.

1.12 **6232.1100 SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS FOR CAMP RIPLEY ARCHERY HUNT.**

1.13 **Subpart 1. Access to Camp Ripley.** This subpart applies to access into Camp Ripley  
1.14 during the archery hunt.

1.15 A. Archers with valid permits must enter and leave Camp Ripley only by way  
1.16 of the southeast railroad gate and only from ~~noon~~ 5:00 a.m. on the day before the hunt  
1.17 to 8:00 p.m. on the last day of the hunt.

1.20 **6232.2550 YOUTH SPECIAL DEER HUNTS.**

1.23 are open by permit only during the 2010 season.

6.25 **6232.2560 YOUTH SPECIAL DEER SEASONS.**

6.26 Subpart 1. Requirements. Youths participating in youth special deer seasons must  
6.27 obtain a license for taking deer by firearms, valid for any season option, by the beginning  
6.28 date of the special season. A youth special season participant may take one deer, which  
6.29 must be antlerless. One bonus permit may be used. An adult mentor age 18 or older  
6.30 authorized by the youth's parent or guardian must accompany the youth hunter at all times  
6.31 during the hunt. The accompanying adult may not hunt. Party hunting is not allowed. The  
6.32 blaze orange requirements in Minnesota Statutes, section 97B.071, paragraph (a), apply

7.1 to all hunters and trappers, and all adult mentors of youth hunters, in the areas open to  
7.2 firearms deer hunting during the youth special seasons established in this part.

7.3 Subp. 2. **Open areas.** Open areas and dates for youth special deer seasons shall be  
7.4 established annually by the commissioner. For 2010, permit areas 101, 105, 111, 114, 201,  
7.5 203, 208, 209, 256, 257, 260, 263, 264, 267, 268, 338, 339, 341, 342, 343, 344, 345, 346,  
7.6 347, 348, 349, and 601 are open October 21 through 24 for taking deer of either sex by  
7.7 firearms for youth ten to 15 years old at the time of the hunt. Old Mill State Park, Lake  
7.8 Bronson State Park, Hayes Lake State Park, Zippel Bay State Park, and the Whitewater  
7.9 Game Refuge are open for this hunt.

7.10 **EFFECTIVE PERIOD.** The emergency amendments to Minnesota Rules, parts  
7.11 6232.0900, 6232.1100, 6232.2550, and 6232.2560, expire December 31, 2010. After  
7.12 the emergency amendments expire, the permanent rules as they read prior to those  
7.13 amendments again take effect, except as they may be amended by permanent rule.
