Subpart 1. Requirements. Youths participating in youth special deer seasons must 6.26 obtain a license for taking deer by firearms, valid for any season option, by the beginning 6.27 date of the special season. A youth special season participant may take one deer, which 6.28 must be antlerless. One bonus permit may be used. An adult mentor age 18 or older 6.29 authorized by the youth's parent or guardian must accompany the youth hunter at all times 6.30 during the hunt. The accompanying adult may not hunt. Party hunting is not allowed. The 6.31 blaze orange requirements in Minnesota Statutes, section 97B.071, paragraph (a), apply 6.32
