1.7	antlerless deer and legal bucks. Not more than 2,500 permits shall be issued for each

1.9	Subp. 4. Bag limits. The bag limit for the Camp Ripley archery hunt is two deer.
1.10	Hunters may use bonus permits to take antlerless deer and may take a deer of either sex on
1.11	a regular license. Only one legal buck may be taken during this hunt.

6232.2560 YOUTH SPECIAL DEER SEASONS.

<u>Subpart 1.</u> <u>Season requirements.</u> Youths participating in youth special deer seasons must obtain a license for taking deer by firearms, valid for any season option, by the

beginning date of the special season. A youth special season participant may take one 5.1 deer, which must be antlerless of either sex. One bonus permit may be used. Only one 5.2 legal buck may be taken during this hunt and in the state per year. An adult mentor age 18 5.3 or older authorized by the youth's parent or guardian must accompany the youth hunter at 5.4 all times during the hunt. The accompanying adult may not hunt. Party hunting is not 5.5 allowed. The blaze orange requirements in Minnesota Statutes, section 97B.071, paragraph 5.6 (a), apply to all hunters and trappers, and all adult mentors of youth hunters, in the areas 5.7 open to firearms deer hunting during the youth special seasons established in this part. 5.8 5.9 Subp. 2. Open areas. Open areas and dates for youth deer seasons shall be established annually by the commissioner. For 2013, permit areas 101, 105, 111, 114, 201, 203, 208, 5.10 209, 256, 257, 260, 263, 264, 267, 268, 338, 339, 341, 343, 344, 345, 346, 347, 348, 349, 5.11 601, and 602 are open October 17 to 20 for taking either sex deer by firearms for youth 5.12 who are at least age ten and under age 16 at the time of the hunt. Whitewater Game Refuge 5.13 is open for taking either sex deer by eligible youth. One bonus permit may be used, but a 5.14 hunter may not take more than one deer. Only one legal buck may be taken during this hunt. 5.15 Subp. 3. Special archery season. Sand Prairie Wildlife Management Area in 5.16 Stearns County is open during the regular archery season for youth ages ten to 17. The 5.17 bag limit is one. The youth archery season is closed from November 9 to 17, when a 5.18 special deer hunt for disabled individuals will be held on the wildlife management area. 5.19 The bag limit is one deer. 5.20 **EFFECTIVE PERIOD.** The emergency amendments to Minnesota Rules, parts 5.21 6232.0900, 6232.2550, and 6232.2560, expire December 31, 2013. After the emergency 5.22 amendments expire, the permanent rules as they read prior to those amendments again 5.23 take effect, except as they may be amended by permanent rule. 5.24
