1.6	a line beginning at U.S. Highway 53 at the east boundary of the state, thence along U.S.
1.7	Highway 53 to the north boundary of the state, is known as the Lynx Management Zone.

1.10	Subp. 5a. Body-gripping traps; Lynx Management Zone. In the Lynx
1.11	Management Zone, a person may not set, place, or operate, except as a water set, any
1.12	body-gripping trap that has a maximum jaw opening, when set, of greater than five inches
1.13	and less than 7-1/2 inches measured from the inside edges of the body-gripping portions
1.14	of the jaws, unless the trap is set:
1.15	A. at least three feet above the ground or snow level in a tree;
1.16	B. at least three feet above the ground or snow level on a leaning pole six
1.17	inches or less in diameter; or
1.18	C. in a cubby box recessed at least seven inches from the box opening, which
1.19	must be less than 50 square inches in opening size. A cubby box may be constructed of
1.20	any material, but must be constructed and set in a manner that allows an animal to enter
1.21	only through the cubby box opening.
