Description: Project is a multiple activity proposal to improve forest, prairie/grassland and wetland habitats on State Wildlife Management Area (WMA) or State Forest lands in the DNR's Brainerd Wildlife work area (lower Cass, Crow Wing counties). Project will be accomplished through the hiring (contract) of a four person Minnesota Conservation Corps (MCC) crew for six months that will preform various wildlife habitat enhancement efforts summarized in Attachment A. MCC crew will be hired and administered through a joint contract to the Minnesota Deer Hunters Association (Brainerd Chapter), National Wild Turkey Federation (Central Minnesota Gobblers Chapter), and Delta Waterfowl (Brainerd Lakes Chapter). Project site needs, daily supervision and shop/storage space for this crew will be provided by the DNRs Brainerd Area Wildlife Office. As listed under Project Timeline and noted in Attachment A, general throughts are that a crew will be hired and start on April 1st and work to September 30th on wildlife enhancement activities that are pertenant to the time of year (i.e. April-May: contstruct/place/maintain wood duck boxes, prescribed fire, etc.; June-July: forest opening management, noxious/invasive species control, etc.; August-September: forest prescribed burns, bud cap jack pine plantings, etc.). Being the first year of this type of effort, estimates on sites, quantities and cost/unit to be accomplished are a best guess at this time. Attachment A - State WMA/Forest Wildlife Habitat Enhancements, Brainerd Lakes Area

Work Acitivity Summary

<u>Forest Opening Management:</u> There are approximately 200 forest openings in the Brainerd Wildlife Area that originated as old farm fields, logging camps or were constructed with donated habitat funds (MDHA). DNR Wildlife staff is scheduled to reinventory these openings over the next year. Based on inventory findings, opening improvement needs (hand cut trees/brush, herbicide, reseed, mow, etc.) will be identified. MCC Crew will be used to remove (hand cut/pile) and herbicide invading trees/brush along the edges of these openings.

<u>Forest Stand Improvement:</u> As part of various planning efforts (e.g. Subsection Forest Resourve Management Planning), an increase in the red oak forest type has been identified as a landscape priority. MCC Crew will perform stand improvement/release efforts on red oak stands as determined necessary by DNR Wildlife staff.

<u>Forest Protection:</u> As part of various planning efforts (e.g. Subsection Forest Resource Management Planning), an increase in the jack pine and white pine forest types have been identified as a landscape priority. MCC Crew will perform bud capping efforts on these forest types to protect them from deer browsing.


<u>Prairie/Grassland Manageement:</u> Several large, old fields on State WMAs have significant amounts of trees/brush that have invaded along the edges of these fields. MCC Crew will hand cut, remove (pile, burn) and herbicide invading trees/brush.

<u>Prescribed Burns (Forest or Prairie/Grassland):</u> MCC Crew will be trained as DNR Firefighers and assist DNR staff with prescribed fire efforts for either forests or prairie/grassland habitat enhancement.

<u>Habitat Evaluation/Monitoring:</u> MCC Crew will assist DNR staff with Native Plant Community (NPC) field inventory efforts for work activities in this project that may trigger NPC inventory needs. Expected to be only a few sites, probably for Noxious/Invasive Weed Control (Buckthorn) and Forest Stand Improvement efforts.

<u>Noxious/Invasive Weed Control:</u> In preparation for planned aspen, oak timber sales, MCC Crew will hand cut competing/understory Buckthorn so that aspen and oak can successfully regenerate.

<u>Waterfowl Nest Structures:</u> DNR Brainerd Area Wildlife currently maintains 200+- wood duck boxes. MCC Crew will assist in the maintenance of existing boxes and construct/place an additional 200 new wood duck boxes on public lands/wetlands.

These funds have been determined through the Conservation Partners Legacy Grant submitted by the cooperative effort of the Minnesota Department of Natural Recourses, MN Deer Hunters Assoc. (Brainerd Chapter), National Wild Turkey Federation (Central MN Gobblers Chapter) and Delta Waterfowl (Brainerd Lakes Chapter).

Should the State Board Funding not meet approval, then the local chapter will have to raise the funds through its annual Hunting Heritage Banquet, held on the First Saturday in March. Proceeds released within 30 days.
