THe lake itself is in good condition at this time, but goes thru poorer periods due to high water and fish impact. Just buffering the immediate shoreline will be extremely beneficial.

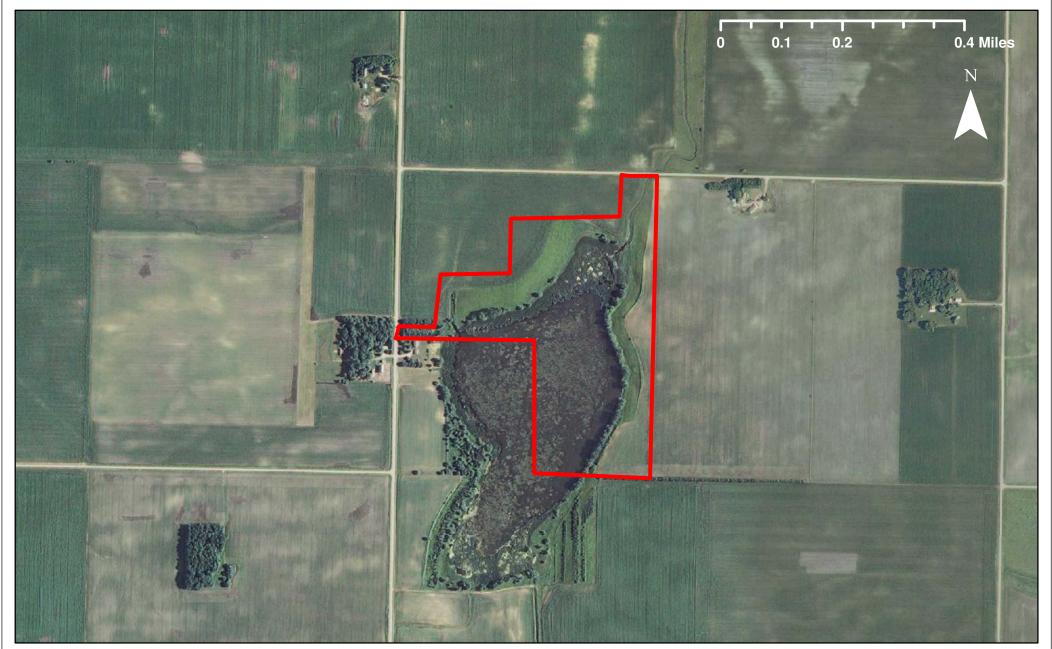
