The securing of perpetual conservation easements on these two sites is a necessary first step toward restoration of wetland and watershed function. Wetland restoration will be done separately, following the easement establishment.

Site 1 - consists of 38.5 acres in the Cannon River watershed. There are 6 drained, restorable wetland basins covering 7 acres. These basins will be restored; the remaining 31.5 acres will be planted to prairie using a diverse mix of native forbs and grasses.

Site 2 - consists of 70.5 acres on Bull Run Creek in the Le Sueur River watershed. There are 11 acres of drained, restorable, riverine wetland on the site. This wetland will be restored; the remaining 59.5 acres will be planted to prairie using a diverse mix of native forbs and grasses. In addition to wetland restoration, there may be a subsequent opportunity to restore the straightened and channelized stream to its natural meandering channel.

Both of these restorations will measurably contribute to the restoration of watershed function in the impaired Cannon and Le Sueur River watersheds. The Le Sueur River, in particular, has been shown to be a major contributor of sediment to the Minnesota River. Impairment of watershed function resulting from widespread agricultural drainage will be corrected incrementally, by carrying out numerous projects like these across these watersheds. In addition to water-quality and watershed-function benefits, restoration of these sites will provide substantial aquatic

habitat benefits for fish and wildlife.




