Project description and benefits (box will expand as typed into, not to be longer than 2 pages):

Rice Creek extends from Howard Lake to the Mississippi River for 17.5 miles in Anoka and Ramsey Counties. Restoration of Rice Creek has the ability to undo the consequences of past efforts to control Rice Creek through channelization and confinement which has resulted in increased sedimentation of downstream Long Lake, loss of fish and wildlife habitat, and increased downstream flood flows. The project will also increase the recreational use of Rice Creek as a regional water trail now that the physical barriers that prevented access across land owned by the US Army (Twin Cities Ammunitions Arsenal) were removed in 2008. This project is focused on approximately 5600 feet of creek located in the Ramsey County - Rice Creek North Regional Trails Park.

Benefits of the the project include:

- Restoring the shoreline and riparian habitats of Middle Rice Creek thereby enhancing the quality and diversity of fish and wildlife habitat in the creek and adjoining floodplain.
- Restoring the water quality and stream biota, in this portion of the creek.
- Providing unrestricted access from the headwater lakes to the Mississippi River.

Rice Creek is unique in many ways, but most notably is that 90% of the adjoining land is publically owned or controlled providing for the opportunity for the restoration of the creek in the midst of the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area. Project beneifts will be achieved through 1) the physical restoration of the creek and floodplain by physical re-meandering and connecting the creek to its floodplain along approximately 5600 feet of the creek, 2) improving fish and wildlife habitat thorugh the streambank erosion control and in-stream fish habitat structures.

Overall Project Deliverables (based on successful completion of restroation activities for all 5 reaches identified in the Middel Rcie Creek Assessment and Stabilization Feasibility Study dated June 2008)

- 1. 16,425 feet of restored and re-meandered channel. The project is broken down into 5 reaches which can be treated as separate project areas.
- 2. Reduce downstream sedimentation by 15,000 cu. yds./5 years
- 3. Sustained Index of Biological Integrity scores above impairment threshold of 46 for fish and 57 for invertebrates

This applicattion to the Lessard/Sams Outdoor Heritiage Council is for funding to complete restroation activities in reach 3 (Couty Road I to Interstate 35W).

Deleiverable for this project reach will include:

- 1. 5,000 feet of restored and re-meandered channel
- 2. Reduce sediment delivery from bank erosion by 1,000 cubic yards per year
- 3. Increase fish and macro-invertabrate habitat measured by a sustained IBI score of the impairment thresholds of 46 for fish and 57 for invertebrates

The project builds off of a successful pilot restoration project in 2004, which led to a project feasibility report (2008) which quantified project scope and cost estimates. The project is part of a long range goal of restoring altered natural water courses in the Rice Creek Watershed. The District and the County are committed to continuing to improve public access and recreation opportunities in the project area.

The Rice Creek Watershed District will be responsible for long-term management of the in-stream and re-meander projects and the associatted native vegetation establishment in and along Middle Rice Creek. Ramsy Co. Parks will retain overall management of the site under the umbrella of their Park Operations Plan.

b. What short- and long-term maintenance work is required to sustain the habitat work you will do?

There will be a need for both short-term and long-term maintenance of the project. Short term efforts will involve inspection and maintenance of the vegetative resoptration inlcuding weeding, spot-spraying and re-seeding and re-planting. Long-term maintenance will involve annual inspections and periodic maintenance of the restored vegetation through a combination of burning, mowing and or spraying. There will be a slight chance that some addittional bank stablization in the re-meandered sections of the creek will need to be done.

c. Who will complete this maintenance work, and how will it be funded?

The Rice Creek Watershed Distrcit will be responsible for these maintenance acitvities. They will be performed with contracted labor either through the Minnesota Conservation Corp. or private vendors. the District has an established O&M fund that will be used for this purpose.

d. Will the CPL funds supplant any existing funds?

This is a new project and is not budgeted under any other District program therfore there will not be any supplantting of existing funds.
