Birding Opportunities at Bluestem Prairie SNA

Bluestem Prairie SNA consists of 2.855 acres of mesic tallgrass prairie and wet blacksoil prairie located in what was once Glacial Lake Agassiz. The Buffalo River marks the north boundary of the SNA, commonly considered one of the highest quality prairie sites in the United States. Adjacent Buffalo River State Park adds to the size and importance of the native prairie protected here. More than 115 species of birds have been seen on the SNA including the Greater Prairie Chicken, Wilson's Phalarope and Nelson's Sharptailed Sparrow. The unit is partially owned by The Nature Conservancy, and they maintain two blinds where visitors can watch Prairie Chickens display during March and April. The dancing is spectacular and you can reserve front row seats by calling The Nature conservancy at 218-498-2679.

Taxonomy, Season and Abundance Key

The names and taxonomic arrangement of species follows that of the Checklist of the Birds of Minnesota (January, 2005) prepared by the Minnesota Ornithological Union (MOU) Records Committee.

The **seasons** in the checklist are defined as follows:

Sp (Spring) = March, April, May

Su (Summer) = June, July

Fa (Fall) = August, September, October, November

Wi (Winter) = December, January, February

Abundance codes are defined as follows:

C = Common — present, relatively easy to find

U = Uncommon — observed, may be difficult to find

O = Occasional — may or may not be present in any year

R = Rare — has occurred at least once, may recur
