



Minnesota was named "Best Trails State" in the country in 2010. The award was presented by American Trails, the only national nonprofit organization working on behalf of all trail types, including bicycling, hiking, cross-country skiing, equestrian, snowmobile, off-highway vehicle and water trails.



Visit Minnesota state parks and recreation areas: A vehicle permit is required to enter Minnesota state parks and recreation areas. A one-day permit will provide a whole day of fun for just \$5. Year-round permits, \$25, provide unlimited access for a full year from the month of purchase. Parks and recreation areas are open 365 days a year, including holidays. Permits can be purchased at any Minnesota state park office or at Twin Cities REI Stores.

Minnesota state trails are free: There is no charge to hike, bike, or in-line skate on Minnesota state trails.

Families and individuals of any age are invited to experience the outdoors at an I Can Camp!, I Can Fish!, I Can Climb! or I Can Paddle! program. Archery in the Parks

Learn to shoot a bow and arrow with our trained staff! They will provide you with an introduction to archery and no experience or equipment is needed. The program runs weekends from Memorial Day through Labor Day. It is an extension of the Archery in the Schools program.

State Trails

New sections of state trails are added every year, providing you more miles of biking, hiking, and other trail recreation. Two highlights of 2010 included the grand opening of the 13-mile Great River Ridge State Trail, which runs from Plainview to Co. Rd. 9 near Eyota, and the completion of a new 16.5-mile segment of the Paul Bunyan State Trail between Guthrie and Walker. The Paul Bunyan State Trail, now one of the longest paved rail-trails in the country, was inducted to the Rail-Trail Hall of Fame. There are more programs than ever on Minnesota state trails this spring and summer. See page 58.


Camper Cabins

Camper cabins sleep up to six people, cost \$45 or \$50 a night, and are available at 25 state parks. To make reservations call 1-866-85PARKS or go to stayatmnparks.com. In 2010, new cabins opened at Afton, Flandrau and Maplewood state parks. In 2011, a dozen more will open, starting with three at Lake Shetek State Park.

Getting Started

What to bring:

Come as you are! It is recommended that you wear comfortable clothes, sturdy shoes, and dress for the weather (a raincoat is always a good idea). Keep the following in a pack or bag when you visit:



A filled water bottle
Insect repellant
Sunscreen
Sunglasses
A snack (like trail mix or an energy bar)
Optional: camera, binoculars, a first-aid kit, and a GPS unit or compass.
Note: Be aware that cell phones often do not work in wooded areas.

Leave firewood at home:

When camping or picnicking at any Minnesota state park, state forest, or other state land, use only firewood purchased at the park or from an approved vendor. Firewood restrictions prohibit bringing firewood from home (except unpainted and unstained dimensional lumber, such as two-by-four scraps), because it might contain pests like the Emerald Ash Borer, which can destroy trees and devastate forests. For a list of approved vendors and more details, visit mndnr. gov/firewood.





Join the Hiking Club:

Explore designated hiking trails and collect patches and other rewards! To participate, pick up a Hiking Club kit (\$14.95) next time you're at a Minnesota state park, then follow the trails marked with "Hiking Club" signs. When you find the password posted on each trail, enter it in your book, and watch your miles add up toward the prize levels.

Visit 71 Minnesota state parks and recreation areas:

As a Passport Club member, your goal is to visit 71 Minnesota's magnificent state parks and recreation areas, from Afton to Zippel Bay. You'll be rewarded for your travels with patches, free nights of camping, and—when you've visited them all—a customized plaque with your name on it. The Passport Club kit (\$14.95) can be purchased at most state parks.



Weather-related cancellations:

Naturalists are a hardy bunch who endure all kinds of weather, but the safety and comfort of our visitors comes first. Occasionally, due to flooding, extreme heat and severe weather in general, a program may be canceled or changed. When in doubt, call the park or check for updates online at mndnr.gov/parksandtrails.









Rent canoes, kayaks, and other equipment:

Many Minnesota state parks have rental equipment available, including canoes, kayaks, motorboats, and personal flotation devices. Inspire a young naturalist:

Pick up free Junior Park Naturalist activity booklets—three in all—at any Minnesota state park office and start exploring! When kids complete a booklet, they earn a patch and a certificate to recognize them as a Junior Park Naturalist. After completing all three they become official "nature experts" with a patch to prove it.


MinnAqua Programs:

This great river starts as merely a stream at Lake Itasca and develops into a mighty river gorge miles wide when it leaves the state. These canoe trips will be done in four segments over the summer, beginning near the headwaters and ending near Cass Lake.

SATURDAY, JUNE 18: Lake Itasca to Wanagan Landing is a five-mile stretch (approx. three hours) traveling out of the park and past pristine bog and spruce forest. This section gives a feel of the infant Mississippi River.

SATURDAY, JULY 9: Coffee Pot Landing through Stumphges Rapids is a nine-mile stretch (approx. five hours) that will challenge the novice canoeist with a couple of sets of shallow class I rapids.

Each trip will be guided by park naturalists from Itasca and Lake Bemidji state parks, who will share information and lore of the Mississippi River. These sections of the river are generally good for novice canoeists although river conditions can change significantly with heavy rainfall.


Accelerating natural resource management

Stepped up efforts to remove invasive species (such as this garlic mustard at Fort Snelling State Park) are helping to re-establish Minnesota's original landscape. The DNR conducted detection, prevention, and response on over 20,000 acres of state park lands in 2010.



Accelerating facility maintenance and rehabilitation

The DNR is fixing up buildings and bridges (such as this one completed in 2010 on the Heartland State Trail) as well as making park and trail facilities more accessible to all users.



Providing grants to parks and trails

Grants available to cities and counties help make it possible to purchase important pieces of land for outdoor recreation at park and trail facilities of regional or statewide significance. This 26-acre addition to Brophy Lake Park in Douglas County—a scenic stop on the Central Lakes State Trail near Alexandria—is just one example.

Connecting people to the outdoors

Many things are being done to get people outdoors, with help from the new Minnesota Naturalist Corps (including these naturalists at Wild River State Park). This group of naturalists makes it possible to provide additional family-oriented programs at Minnesota state parks and trails. Participation in naturalist-led programs increased by nearly 50,000 people in 2010.



STAY OVERNIGHT

Minnesota state parks and recreation areas offer a surprising variety of overnight accommodations, including:

CAMPSITES are \$12-\$24/night at most campgrounds. For those in need of plug-ins, there are hundreds of 50-amp electrical sites.

CAMPER CABINS (\$45-\$50/night) sleep up to six people. Cook your meals over the outdoor fire ring or heat them up in a slow cooker indoors. Bunk beds and mattresses are providedjust bring your own sleeping bags.

FULLY FURNISHED CABINS can be found at Itasca, Tettegouche, St. Croix and Scenic state parks. Cost and capacity vary.

GUESTHOUSES at Bear Head Lake, St. Croix, Savanna Portage and Wild River state parks (\$105-\$215/night) are fully furnished, open year-round and can accommodate up to 15 people.

FOUR-SEASON SUITES and HISTORIC DOUGLAS LODGE at Itasca State Park—Historic Douglas Lodge offers charming guest rooms for \$75-\$127/night and a full-service restaurant. The Four-season Suites (\$99-\$138/night) come with two queen-size beds, kitchenettes, phones and even cable TV.


TIPIS—Experience a bit of history and tradition by staying in one of two tipis (\$30/night) at Upper Sioux Agency State Park.
