

Site Features:

- •A 3+ acre harbor where small craft can seek protection from storms.
- 3 ramps for boat launching and retrieval.
- Kayak launch ramp.
- Height adjustable docks.
- Parking includes 54 car/trailer spaces and 23 additional car only spaces.
- · Public rest rooms.
- Public space with walkways and benches along the harbor.
- Shore fishing from 3 platforms.
- Solar collector panels help provide power for the site, with excess power fed back to the local power grid.
- Pedestrian Tunnel.
- Nearby lodging and restaurants.
