Forest Stewardship Plan Registration for 2c MFL Classification



The 2c Managed Forest Land (MFL) classification allows property owners that own forested land and who actively abide by the prescriptions set forth in a qualifying forest management plan to potentially receive a reduced class rate of 0.65 percent on any eligible land. Your forest stewardship plan must be registered with the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to qualify for the 2c MFL property classification. For your forest stewardship plan to be on the DNR registered plan list in time for the 2c MFL tax classification for a given year, the following requirements must be met:

- Your land must meet DNR qualifications for a forest stewardship plan.
- The plan must be written by a DNR approved plan preparer.
- The plan must be submitted to the DNR for registration by May 1st.
- The plan must be approved by the DNR by May 14th. Your forester will work with the DNR to ensure that it is approved by that date.
- Invoices for the registration fee will be sent by May 15th. Payment for the registration fee must be received by the DNR by June 14th.

Check with your County regarding other requirements for the 2c Managed Forest Land property classification.
