EIS Scoping

October 2005

Scoping identified the major environmental issues and alternatives that the EIS would look at. It included a public review and comment period and a public meeting.

Draft EIS

October 2009

The DEIS described potential environmental effects, alternatives to the proposed project, and potential mitigation measures. It included a public review and comment period, and a public meeting to help determine if additional analysis or information was needed.

Consideration of Comments/ Decision to prepare **Supplemental Draft EIS** June 2010 This was an optional step in environmental review. The determination to prepare the SDEIS was based on:

- Significant project changes, including the addition of a land exchange;
- The decision made by the U.S. Forest Service to develop an EIS for the land exchange;
- Deficiencies identified during the public review of the DEIS.

Supplemental Draft EISDecember 2013

The SDEIS included a 90-day public review and comment period and public meetings in Duluth, St. Paul and Aurora.
