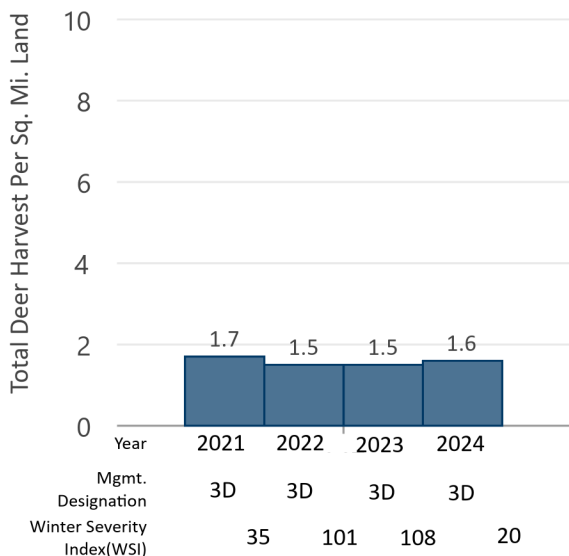

Wildlife Manager Report

Deer Permit Area (DPA) 267 encompasses the central portion of Roseau County. It includes portions of the Lost River State Forest and Roseau Lake WMA in the north. The remainder is comprised of private land. The severe winters of 2021-22 and 2022-23 resulted in increased calls regarding fawn mortalities. The two-deer limit, along with the consecutive mild winters of 2023-24 and 2024-25, will help allow this herd to recover from the impacts of severe winters.
