1.2 **Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: 2008 Camp Ripley Archery**  
1.3 **Deer Hunt Quota and Youth Deer Hunts and Seasons**

1.4 **6232.0900 CAMP RIPLEY ARCHERY HUNT.**

1.5 Subpart 1. **Deer season and hunter quota.** Camp Ripley may be open, by permit  
1.6 only, for the taking of deer by archery. Open dates are ~~the two-day period beginning the~~  
1.7 ~~third Thursday in October and the two-day period beginning the last Saturday in October~~  
1.8 19 and 20 and October 26 and 27.

1.9 Subp. 2. **Permit required to hunt.** Only persons possessing a valid Minnesota  
1.10 archery ~~or all-season deer hunting~~ license, an unused possession tag valid for taking a deer  
1.11 by archery, and a permit validated for the Camp Ripley archery hunt will be permitted to  
1.12 enter Camp Ripley. Permits are not transferable between individuals or hunting dates. The  
1.13 permit for the Camp Ripley archery hunt authorizes the permit holder to take one deer at  
1.14 Camp Ripley, unless otherwise authorized by the commissioner. A permit holder may not  
1.15 take any species other than deer at Camp Ripley.

1.16 Subp. 3. **Antlerless deer and legal bucks.** In 2008, Camp Ripley is open for the  
1.17 taking of antlerless deer and legal bucks. Not more than 2,500 permits shall be issued  
1.18 for each two-day hunting period.

1.19 Subp. 4. **Bag limits.** The bag limit for the Camp Ripley archery hunt is two deer.  
1.20 Hunters may use bonus permits to take antlerless deer and may take a deer of either sex on  
1.21 their regular license. Only one legal buck may be taken during this hunt.

1.22 **6232.2550 YOUTH SPECIAL DEER HUNTS.**

1.23 Subpart 1. **General requirements.** Youth special deer hunt permittees may hunt in  
1.24 open areas and times designated by the commissioner. All participating youths and a  
1.25 parent or guardian authorized by the parent must attend ~~a~~ the mandatory ~~orientation and~~

2.1 prehunt orientation/clinic. During the hunt, youth participants must be accompanied by  
 2.2 ~~at least one adult mentor~~ a parent or guardian authorized by the parent who is at least 18  
 2.3 years of age ~~and authorized by the youth's parent or guardian.~~ The accompanying adult  
 2.4 may not hunt. Party hunting is not allowed. Persons participating in youth archery special  
 2.5 deer hunts must obtain a valid license for taking deer by archery by the beginning date  
 2.6 of the respective hunt. Persons participating in youth firearms special deer hunts must  
 2.7 obtain a license for taking deer by firearms, valid for any zone or season option, by the  
 2.8 beginning date of the respective hunt. The blaze orange requirements in Minnesota  
 2.9 Statutes, section 97B.071, paragraph (a), apply to all hunters and trappers, and all adult  
 2.10 mentors of youth hunters, in areas open to youth firearms deer hunting during the open  
 2.11 hunting dates established in this part.

2.13 Subp. 3. Open areas. The youth special deer hunt areas described in items A to M  
 2.14 are open by permit only during the 2008 season.

6.6 **6232.2560 YOUTH SPECIAL DEER SEASONS.**

6.7 Subpart 1. Requirements. Youths participating in youth special deer seasons must  
 6.8 obtain a license for taking deer by firearms, valid for any zone or season option, by the  
 6.9 beginning date of the special season. A youth special season participant may take one deer,  
 6.10 which must be antlerless. One bonus permit may be used. An adult mentor age 18 or older  
 6.11 authorized by the youth's parent or guardian must accompany the youth hunter at all times  
 6.12 during the hunt. The accompanying adult may not hunt. Party hunting is not allowed. The  
 6.13 blaze orange requirements in Minnesota Statutes, section 97B.071, paragraph (a), apply  
 6.14 to all hunters and trappers, and all adult mentors of youth hunters, in the areas open to  
 6.15 firearms deer hunting during the youth special seasons established in this part.

6.16 Subp. 2. Open areas. Open areas and dates for youth deer seasons shall be  
 6.17 established annually by the commissioner. For 2008, Kittson, Lake of the Woods,  
 6.18 Marshall, Pennington, and Roseau Counties are open October 18 and 19 for taking  
 6.19 antlerless deer by firearms for youth who are at least age 12 and under age 15 at the time  
 6.20 of the hunt. Old Mill State Park, Lake Bronson State Park, Hayes Lake State Park, and  
 6.21 Zippel Bay State Park are open to taking antlerless deer by eligible youth. One bonus  
 6.22 permit may be used, but a hunter may not take more than one deer.

6.23 **EFFECTIVE PERIOD.** The emergency amendments to Minnesota Rules, parts  
 6.24 6232.0900, 6232.2550, and 6232.2560, expire December 31, 2008. After the emergency  
 6.25 amendments expire, the permanent rules as they read prior to those amendments again  
 6.26 take effect, except as they may be amended by permanent rule.
