Taking fish for bait purposes from all Minnesota waters of Lake Superior 3.1 and all waters of the St. Louis River downstream of the Fond du Lac Dam in St. Louis 3.2 and Carlton Counties, including any and all outflows, estuaries, streams, creeks, or waters 3.3 adjacent to or flowing into these waters, is prohibited, except as provided in item B. 3.4 B.
