1.2 **Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: 2017 Elk Season**

1.3 **6232.4300 SEASONS 2017 SEASON DATES AND OPEN AREAS QUOTAS FOR**
1.4 **TAKING ELK.**

1.5 [For text of subp 1, see M.R.]

1.6 Subp. 1a. **Season dates.** Licensed hunters may take elk during the following 2017
1.7 seasons:

1.8 A. season A: September 9 to 17; and

1.9 B. season B: October 7 to 15.

1.10 **Subp. 2. Open areas.**

1.11 A. ~~A license for the Grygla elk zones is valid for taking elk within~~ The Primary
1.12 Grygla Elk Zone prescribed in part 6232.4600, subpart 1, and the Secondary Grygla Elk
1.13 Zone ~~as described~~ prescribed in part 6232.4600, subpart 2, are closed in 2017.

1.14 [For text of item B, see M.R.]

1.15 C. A license for the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone is valid for taking elk
1.16 within the elk zone prescribed in part 6232.4600, subpart 4.

1.17 Subp. 3. **Quotas.** The number of available licenses for the 2017 elk-hunting season
1.18 is eight in the Kittson County Central Elk Zone and five in the Kittson County Northeast
1.19 Elk Zone, distributed as follows:

1.20 A. season A: three licenses in the Kittson County Central Elk Zone valid for
1.21 legal antlered bull elk, one license in the Kittson County Central Elk Zone for a legal
1.22 antlerless elk, and two licenses in the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone valid for legal
1.23 antlered bull elk; and

2.1 B. season B: three licenses in the Kittson County Central Elk Zone valid for
2.2 legal antlered bull elk, one license in the Kittson County Central Elk Zone for a legal
2.3 antlerless elk, and three licenses in the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone valid for
2.4 legal antlered bull elk.

2.5 **6232.4400 GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR TAKING ELK.**

2.7 Subp. 7. **Orientation required.** A successful applicant may only obtain an elk
2.8 license by attending an orientation session at ~~the Thief Lake Wildlife Management Area~~
2.9 headquarters a location designated by the commissioner of natural resources.

2.10 Subp. 8. **Registration.** Within 24 hours of taking an elk, a person must present and
2.11 register the elk in person at an elk-registration station designated by the commissioner
2.12 of natural resources.

2.13 **6232.4500 ELK LICENSE APPLICATION PROCEDURE.**

2.14 Subpart 1. **General provisions.** The provisions in this part apply to the elk license
2.15 application process.

2.16 A. If the number of applications for any zone and season exceeds the quota, a
2.17 random selection will be conducted to determine the successful applicants.

2.19 D. The application deadline is the Friday nearest ~~July~~ June 15.

2.22 Subp. 3. **Drawing procedure.**

3.1 A. A random drawing from a pool consisting of general drawing applicants
3.2 must be used to distribute licenses that are offered in the Kittson County Central and
3.3 Northeast Elk Zones.

3.4 ~~A. B. If one or more than one qualified landowners in either zone apply, a~~
3.5 ~~drawing to select one landowner in the Primary and Secondary Grygla Elk Zones,~~
3.6 ~~combined, and one landowner in the Kittson County Central and Northeast Elk Zone shall~~
3.7 ~~occur first. The remaining parties shall then be selected in a general drawing to finalize~~
3.8 ~~successful parties. If no qualified landowners apply, all licenses shall be drawn from the~~
3.9 ~~general pool of applicants. Zones applies, a drawing to select one landowner licensee for~~
3.10 each zone must occur first.

3.11 ~~B. C.~~ There shall also be alternate parties drawn from the pool of unsuccessful
3.12 parties. These parties would be offered the opportunity to purchase licenses that have
3.13 been offered to a successful party, but not purchased. The pool consists of the remaining
3.14 landowners, tenants, and parties from the general drawing. An alternate party shall only
3.15 be notified in the event that a successful party decides not to purchase a license.

3.16 **EFFECTIVE PERIOD.** The emergency amendments to Minnesota Rules, parts
3.17 6232.4300, 6232.4400, and 6232.4500, expire March 1, 2018. After the emergency
3.18 amendments expire, the permanent rules as they read before the amendments again take
3.19 effect, except as they may be amended by permanent rule.
