1.4 **6230.0200 SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREAS.**

1.6 **Subp. 5. Areas closed to hunting and trapping.**

1.7 A. The following wildlife management areas are closed to hunting and trapping:

1.8 (1) Boerner Wildlife Management Area in Sibley County, ~~the~~;

1.9 (2) Buelow Wildlife Management Area in Steele County, ~~the~~;

1.10 (3) Bryson Wildlife Management Area in Freeborn County, ~~the~~;

1.11 (4) Chapa-Kak-Say-Za Wildlife Management Area in Steele County; and

1.13 (5) Hutchinson Wildlife Management Area in McLeod County ~~are closed to~~
1.14 ~~the hunting and trapping of all species.~~

1.15 B. The Sand Prairie Wildlife Management Area in Sherburne County is closed to
1.16 ~~the hunting and trapping of all species, except for:~~

1.17 (1) hunting by individuals with disabilities participating in a special hunt;

1.18 (2) youth ages ten to 17 who are participating in the regular archery season.

1.19 Youth may take one deer under this subitem but may not hunt during events for individuals
1.20 with disabilities; and

1.21 (3) youth up to age 17 during the spring turkey season.

3.1 **6230.0250 GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR USE OF WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT**

3.4 Subp. 7. **Overnight use.** A person may not camp on or remain in a vehicle overnight
3.5 in any wildlife management area, except by permit or where posted for this use by the
3.6 commissioner. A person may not leave a vehicle, trailer, or tent unoccupied or unattended
3.7 overnight within a wildlife management area, ~~except by permit or in areas and at times~~
3.8 ~~designated by signs for overnight use. A vehicle, trailer, or tent lawfully left overnight must~~
3.9 ~~be occupied or attended.~~ In camping areas from one hour after sundown to one hour before
3.10 sunrise, which are designated quiet hours, a person may not make noise at a level above
3.11 that of a quiet conversation.

3.13 **6230.0295 VERMILLION HIGHLANDS WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA.**

3.14 Subpart 1. **Hunting.** The Vermillion Highlands Wildlife Management Area located
3.15 in Dakota County is closed to all hunting and trapping except:

- 3.16 A. archery, firearms, and muzzleloader deer hunting by special permit only;
- 3.17 B. pheasant and Canada goose hunting starting on the day following the close of
3.18 the muzzleloader deer season through the end of the respective statewide seasons;
- 3.19 C. trapping and predator hunting beginning January 1 by special permit only; and
- 3.20 D. spring turkey hunting.

6.9 **6234.0600 TAKING JACK RABBITS, COTTONTAIL RABBITS, AND SNOWSHOE**

6.12 Subp. 2. **Bag limits.** A person may not take more than ten cottontail rabbits, ~~jack~~
6.13 ~~rabbits,~~ and snowshoe hares, combined, per day or possess more than 20 cottontail rabbits;
6.14 ~~jack rabbits,~~ and snowshoe hares, combined, at a time. A person may not take more than
6.15 one jack rabbit per day or possess more than three jack rabbits, combined, at a time.

6.16 **6234.1400 TAKING WEASELS, BADGER, AND OPOSSUM.**

6.17 Subpart 1. **Open season.** Long-tailed weasels, short-tailed weasels, badgers, and
6.18 opossums may be taken statewide ~~with~~ by legal firearms, bow and arrow, and ~~by~~ trapping
6.19 from 9:00 a.m. on the Saturday nearest October 22, except in the North
6.20 Mink/Muskrat/Beaver/Otter Zone as described in part 6234.1000, subpart 3, where ~~badger~~
6.21 ~~and opossum~~ long-tailed weasels, short-tailed weasels, badgers, and opossums may be taken
6.22 ~~with~~ by legal firearms, bow and arrow, and ~~by~~ trapping beginning at 9:00 a.m. on the
6.23 Saturday nearest October 17. The season ends March 15.

7.1 **6234.1700 TAKING FISHER AND PINE MARTEN.**

7.2 Subpart 1. **Open season.** Fisher and pine marten may be taken by trapping from the
7.3 first Saturday following Thanksgiving ~~to the Sunday nearest December 12~~ through November
7.4 30.

7.5 Subp. 2. **Bag limits.** The combined limit for fisher and pine marten is ~~five~~ two per
7.6 season, in aggregate. A person may not take more than ~~five~~ two fisher and pine marten,
7.7 combined, per season or possess more than ~~five~~ two fisher and pine marten, combined, at
7.8 a time, except that a person may possess additional pelts that the person lawfully took,
7.9 tagged, and registered during previous seasons.

7.11 **6234.2600 PELT TAGGING AND REGISTRATION.**

7.13 Subp. 3. **Registration of pelts.** The pelt of each bobcat, fisher, pine marten, and otter
7.14 must be presented, along with completed site validation coupons for each fisher, pine marten,
7.15 or otter, by the person taking it, to a state wildlife manager designee for registration before
7.16 the pelt is sold and before the pelt is transported out of the state, but in no event more than
7.17 ~~48~~ 24 hours after the season closes for ~~each species, respectively~~ fisher and marten or 48
7.18 hours after the season closes for otter and bobcat. The entire carcass of bobcat and the entire
7.19 head of pine marten and fisher must be surrendered to the state wildlife manager designee.
7.20 The pelt of bobcat, otter, fisher, and pine marten must have been removed from the carcass.

8.1 Subp. 4. **Open areas.** Wild turkey permit areas are open for the fall turkey season as
8.2 prescribed by the commissioner. Turkey licenses are valid for taking turkeys only in the
8.3 wild turkey permit area specified on the license-, except youth licenses, which are valid
8.4 statewide. The following wild turkey permit areas are open for the 2017 fall season: 501,
8.5 502, 503, 504, 505, 506, 507, 508, 509, 510, 511, and 512.

8.7 **REPEALER.** Minnesota Rules, part 6230.0295, subpart 2, is repealed. The emergency
8.8 amendments to Minnesota Rules, parts 6230.0200; 6230.0250; 6230.0295; 6230.0400; and
8.9 6234.0600, as published in the State Register, volume 41, page 178, August 15, 2016, are
8.10 repealed.

8.11 **EFFECTIVE PERIOD.** The emergency amendments to Minnesota Rules, parts 6230.0200,
8.12 6230.0250, 6230.0295, 6230.0400, 6234.0600, and 6234.1400, expire August 15, 2018.
8.13 The emergency amendments to Minnesota Rules, parts 6234.1700, 6234.2600, and
8.14 6236.0700, expire January 31, 2018. After the emergency amendments expire, the permanent
8.15 rules as they read before those amendments again take effect, except as they may be amended
8.16 by permanent rule.
