## Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: 2019 Deer Seasons and Special Hunts

### 6232.0200 DEFINITIONS.

[For text of subparts 1 to 4, see Minnesota Rules]
Subp. 4a. Deer permit area. "Deer permit area" means an area of the state consisting of one or more deer registration blocks according to part 6232.1750. Deer permit areas open for taking legal bucks and antlerless deer during the deer season are defined as follows:
A. "intensive deer permit area," and "managed deer permit area," means and "unlimited antlerless deer permit area" mean a deer permit area where taking deer of either sex is authorized and multiple bonus permits are authorized within bag limits for each area as prescribed by the commissioner;
B. "lottery deer permit area" means a deer permit area where taking:

(3) either-sex deer is authorized by an archery deer license; and
C. "hunter choice deer permit area" means a deer permit area where taking one deer of either sex is authorized-;
D. "youth-only antlerless deer permit area" means a deer permit area where taking a deer of either sex is authorized only for individuals under age 18 who hold a license to take deer under Minnesota Statutes, section 97A.475, subdivision 2 or 3; and
E. "bucks-only deer permit area" means a deer permit area where only legal bucks may be taken.
[For text of subparts 5 to 12, see Minnesota Rules]
Subp. 13. Fawn. "Fawn" means a deer less than one year of age.

Subp. 14. Chronic wasting disease surveillance area. "Chronic wasting disease surveillance area" means the portions of deer permit areas 277 and 283 east of State Trunk Highway (STH) 4, the portion of deer permit area 219 south of STH 55, and the portion of deer permit area 285 north of STH 7.

Subp. 15. Chronic wasting disease early detection area. "Chronic wasting disease early detection area" means deer permit area 604.

Subp. 16. Chronic wasting disease control area. "Chronic wasting disease control area" means deer permit areas 255,343 , and 344.

Subp. 17. Chronic wasting disease persistent infection area. "Chronic wasting disease persistent infection area" means deer permit areas 643, 645, 646, 647, 648, 649, and 655.

### 6232.0300 GENERAL RESTRICTIONS FOR TAKING DEER.

Subpart 1. Season options for regular firearms. A firearm deer hunter may purehase a firearm license valid for the regular firearms deer season or a youth firearms license. A muzzleloader deer humter may purehase a muzzleloader license valid for the muzzleloader season or a youth muzzleloader lieense. For the regular firearm season, a hunter must select either the A or B season and this option will be printed on the license at the time of purchase. A person may enly hunt deer by firearms only within the selected season eption indieated on the person's firearm license, except:
A. as prescribed in part 6232.1970, subpart 2;
B. a firearm license for any season option is valid in the Metropolitan Deer Management Zone deer permit area 701 under part 6232.4700, subpart 158, the chronic wasting disease early detection area, and the chronic wasting disease persistent infection area; and
C. youth firearm license holders with a license issued under Minnesota Statutes, section 97A.475, subdivision 2 or 3, may hunt deer in both the statewide $A$ and late southeast $B$ seasons.

## [For text of subpart 2, see Minnesota Rules]

## Subp. 3. Party hunting.

A. A party is a group of two or more licensed deer hunters who are afield hunting together and are all using firearms or all using archery equipment.
B. Except as provided in this subpart, a member of a party may kill a legal buck or antlerless deer for another member of the party who has an unused tag valid for that deer, except:
A. as provided by Minnesota Statutes, section 97B. 301; and.
B. C. In all 300 series the deer permit areas as preseribed specified in part 6232.1300 , subpart 3 , where 6232.0350 , unused tags ean may be used on antlerless deer only.
D. A mixed-weapons group is considered two separate parties.
E. Persons issued permits under Minnesota Statutes, section 97B.055, subdivision 3 , who are hunting in a lottery deer permit area and do not have an either-sex permit may not tag antlerless deer for another member of the party.

## Subp. 6. License purchase Bonus permits and validation.

A. A bonus permit may be purchased any time throughout the open deer seasons. Bonus permits are valid immediately upon purehase, as long as the purehaser has a valid regular lieense. When a regular lieense is purehased after the start of the season for that license, a bents permit is not valid until the waiting period has expired for the regular
lieense. before and throughout the open archery, firearms, and muzzleloader deer seasons. A bonus permit is not valid unless:
(1) it is issued before legal shooting hours on the day it is first used; and
(2) the hunter's regular hunting license is valid under Minnesota Statutes, section 97A.411, subdivision 3.
B. Bonus permits are valid for taking deer by archery, firearms, or muzzleloader in areas where taking more than one deer is authorized, except where taking or tagging more than one deer is authorized solely by landowner permits.
C. Unless otherwise specified, bonus permits are valid in archery, firearms, and muzzleloader special hunts, including early or late season hunts.
B. D. Before a deer is moved from the site of kill, the person tagging the deer must validate the tag a site tag must be validated at the site of kill by the licensed deer hunter whose tag is being used on the deer. Validation consists of using a knife or similar sharp object to cut out or a pen to indelibly mark the appropriate notches on the tag indicating:
(1) the month the deer was taken;
(2) the date the deer was taken; and
(3) the time of day the deer was taken.

## [For text of subpart 7, see Minnesota Rules]

Subp. 8. Bag limit.
A. Except in the chronic wasting disease persistent infection area, a person may not tag more than one legal buck per calendar year using any combination of licenses. In the chronic wasting disease persistent infection area, a person may tag one legal buck during the archery season, the firearms season, and the muzzleloader season, but not more than
three legal bucks per calendar year. A person may not tag more than one deer during a license year by any method, except as authorized in items A to G this subpart.
A.B. In deer permit areas designated as managed өf, intensive, or unlimited antlerless, a person may tag deer with an archery, firearms, or muzzleloader license.
B. C. A person may tag a deer by archery, firearm, or muzzleloader with a bonus permit in specified areas as prescribed in this chapter.
C. D. In no case may a person tag more than five deer per year by firearms, archery, muzzleloader, or all methods combined, except additional deer may be taken as provided in items BE , subitem subitems (4) and (5); E; F; and G and F.
B. E. Except as provided in items E and item F , the total bag limits by deer permit area are as follows:

## [For text of subitems (1) and (2), see Minnesota Rules]

(3) the total aggregate bag limit for intensive deer permit areas is five three deer; and
(4) there is no bag limit for unlimited antlerless deer permit areas; and
(4) (5) in addition to the total bag limits under subitems (1) to (3), a person with a free landowner deer license may take one additional antlerless deer on land owned or leased by the person in hunter choice, managed, and intensive deer permit areas or during the early antlerless deer season.
E.F. Up to two antlerless deer may be taken in the early antlerless deer permit areas as prescribed in part 6232.1750. These deer may be taken in addition to the bag limit established in item $\mathrm{E} \underline{\mathrm{D}}$.

[^0]G. Muzzleleader and arehery deer hunters hunting in deer permit areas 300 to 399 may take deer under the most liberal bag limits preseribed for the deer permit area.

## [For text of subpart 9, see Minnesota Rules]

6232.0350 RESTRICTIONS FOR TAKING DEER; 300 SERIES DEER PERMIT AREAS.

Notwithstanding part 6232.0200, subpart 6, in all 300 series deer permit areas 338 , 339,341 , and 342 , a legal buck is defined as a deer with a minimum of four antler points on at least one antler. Bucks with fewer antler points than the minimum defined points are protected and not legal for harvest. Youth hunters, age 10 to 17, are exempt from this part.

### 6232.0400 REGISTRATION OF DEER.

Subpart 1. [Repealed, 20 SR 2287]
Subp. 2. Registration requirements.
[For text of item A, see Minnesota Rules]
B. Deer must be registered according to item A:
(1) before the deer is processed either privately or commercially; and
(2) within $24 \underline{48}$ hours after the elose of the season in which the deer was taken.

## [For text of subpart 3, see Minnesota Rules]

Subp. 4. General provisions for registration of deer. Registration agents are not required to inspect deer at registration stations. Legally registered deer may be transported anytime during or after the deer hunting season, except as prescribed in subparts 7 to 9 . No part of the carcass, except skin or entrails, may be removed until after the deer has been
registered using one of the methods described in subpart 2 , except that deer may be quartered prior to registration as long as all parts remain together and are presented for registration and the head of the deer remains attached to one quarter. A person may not process a deer unless it has been registered as evidenced by a possession tag or registration confirmation number.

Subp. 5. [See repealer.]

Subp. 6. Deer taken in chronic wasting disease surveillance area. Within 24 hours of harvesting a deer and before transporting the deer out of the area, hunters must present all deer taken in the chronic wasting disease surveillance area on November 9 and 10 at a designated sampling station listed in the 2019 Minnesota Hunting and Trapping Regulations Handbook for mandatory chronic wasting disease sampling.

## Subp. 7. Deer taken in chronic wasting disease early detection area.

A. Carcasses from all deer taken in the chronic wasting disease early detection area must remain in the area unless tagged for transport out of the area by an authorized representative of the Department of Natural Resources or until the results of a test for chronic wasting disease show the disease has not been detected in the harvested deer.
B. Cut and wrapped meat, quarters, or other portions of meat from a deer taken in the chronic wasting disease early detection area may be transported out of the area if no part of the spinal column or head is attached. Antlers, hides, teeth, finished taxidermy mounts, and antlers attached to skull caps that are cleaned of all brain tissue may be transported out of the chronic wasting disease early detection management area.
C. Hunters taking deer in the chronic wasting disease early detection area must comply with this item within 24 hours of harvesting the deer and before transporting the deer out of the area.
(1) Hunters must present all deer taken during the regular firearms season prescribed in part 6232.1300, subpart 8, at a designated sampling station listed in the 2019 Minnesota Hunting and Trapping Regulations Handbook.
(2) Outside the regular firearms season, hunters must submit samples from all deer, except fawns, according to directions provided at collection locations listed in the 2019 Minnesota Hunting and Trapping Regulations Handbook.

Subp. 8. Deer taken in chronic wasting disease control area.
A. Carcasses from all deer taken in the chronic wasting disease control area must remain in the area:
(1) unless transported to the chronic wasting disease persistent infection area;
(2) unless tagged for transport out of the area by an authorized representative of the Department of Natural Resources; or
(3) until results of a test for chronic wasting disease show the disease has not been detected in the harvested deer.
B. Cut and wrapped meat, quarters, or other portions of meat from a deer taken in the chronic wasting disease control area may be transported out of the area if no part of the spinal column or head is attached. Antlers, hides, teeth, finished taxidermy mounts, and antlers attached to skull caps that are cleaned of all brain tissue may be transported out of the chronic wasting disease control area.
C. Within 24 hours of harvesting a deer and before transporting the deer out of the area, hunters must present all deer taken in the chronic wasting disease control area during the opening weekends of each firearms season designated for those areas in part 6232.1300 at a designated sampling station listed in the 2019 Minnesota Hunting and Trapping Regulations Handbook for mandatory chronic wasting disease sampling.

## Subp. 9. Deer taken in chronic wasting disease persistent infection area.

A. Carcasses from all deer taken in the chronic wasting disease persistent infection area must remain in the area unless tagged for transport out of the area by an authorized representative of the Department of Natural Resources or until results of a test for chronic wasting disease show the disease has not been detected in the harvested deer.
B. Cut and wrapped meat, quarters, or other portions of meat from a deer taken in the chronic wasting disease persistent infection area may be transported out of the area if no part of the spinal column or head is attached. Antlers, hides, teeth, finished taxidermy mounts, and antlers attached to skull caps that are cleaned of all brain tissue may be transported out of the chronic wasting disease persistent infection area.
C. Hunters taking deer in the chronic wasting disease persistent infection area must comply with this item within 24 hours of harvesting the deer and before transporting the deer out of the area.
(1) During the regular firearms season prescribed in part 6232.1300 , subpart 8, hunters must present all deer at a designated sampling station listed in the 2019 Minnesota Hunting and Trapping Regulations Handbook.
(2) Outside the regular firearms season, hunters must submit samples from all deer, except fawns, according to directions provided at collection locations listed in the 2019 Minnesota Hunting and Trapping Regulations Handbook.

### 6232.0800 ARCHERY SPECIAL HUNT AREAS AND PROCEDURES.

[For text of subpart 1, see Minnesota Rules]

Subp. 2. Areas. Special bow and arrow hunt archery permits are valid in areas designated by the commissioner and published in the annwal hunting regulations booklet. Unless otherwise specified, hunters must possess a valid special hunt archery permit for the archery special hunt areas under this subpart. In addition to complying with the requirements
10.1 of this part, hunters who are hunting under a special hunt archery permit must meet any requirements of the municipality, park, or area in which the special hunt occurs and of any sponsoring organization. Hunt participants must stay within any boundaries that are posted or that are prescribed by the hunt administrator or on maps provided during a prehunt orientation. The following archery special hunt areas are established for the 2019 season:
A. Pin Oak Prairie Scientific and Natural Area in Fillmore County is open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. No more than six permits shall be issued. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 926;
B. portions of the Carleton State Game Refuge and Arboretum in Dakota and Rice Counties are open November 28 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks in an earn-a-buck hunt. No more than 40 permits shall be issued. Hunters must obtain written permission from the landowner. The bag limit is two deer. This is special hunt 972;
C. portions of the city of Austin and portions of Jay C. Hormel Nature Center are open October 23 through December 19 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks in an earn-a-buck hunt. The city shall issue no more than 60 permits. The bag limit is three deer. This is special hunt 973;
D. portions of the city of Warroad are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. The city shall issue no more than ten permits. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 974;
E. Vermillion Highlands Research, Recreation, and Wildlife Management Area is open September 14 through October 25 and December 16 through 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. No more than 60 permits shall be issued. The bag limit is two deer. This is special hunt 975 ;
F. portions of the city of New Ulm are open October 12 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks in a double earn-a-buck hunt. Hunters must register
11.1 two antlerless deer before harvesting a legal buck. The city shall issue no more than 56 permits. The bag limit is three deer. This is special hunt 976;
G. portions of the city of Red Wing are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. Portions of the city of Red Wing that are identified on maps provided by the hunt administrator are designated as an earn-a-buck hunt. The bag limit is five deer. Permits to hunt are unlimited. This is special hunt 977;
H. portions of the city of Redwood Falls are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks in a double earn-a-buck hunt. Hunters must register two antlerless deer before harvesting a legal buck. The city shall issue no more than 20 permits. The bag limit is three deer. This is special hunt 978;
I. portions of the city of Fergus Falls are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. The city shall issue no more than 20 permits. The bag limit is two deer. This is special hunt 979;
J. portions of the city of Duluth are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. September 14 through November 27 is an earn-a-buck hunt. Beginning November 28, earn-a-buck provisions no longer apply and hunters may harvest a buck without first having harvested an antlerless deer. The city shall issue no more than 400 permits. The bag limit is three deer. This is special hunt 980;
K. portions of the city of Mankato are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks in an earn-a-buck hunt. The city shall issue no more than 40 permits. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 981;
L. portions of the city of Granite Falls are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer only. The city shall issue no more than ten permits. The bag limit is one deer. This is special hunt 982;
M. portions of the city of Ortonville are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks in an earn-a-buck hunt. The city shall issue no more than 30 permits. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 983;
N. portions of the city of Canby are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. The city shall issue no more than 20 permits. The bag limit is two deer. This is special hunt 984;
O. portions of the city of Bemidji identified on maps provided by the hunt administrator are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. The city shall issue no more than 45 permits for the northeast hunt area and 33 permits for the west hunt area. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 985 ;
P. portions of Bemidji Regional Airport in Beltrami County are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. The city of Bemidji shall issue no more than 20 permits. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 986 ;
Q. portions of Greenleaf Lake State Recreation Area in Meeker County are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. Special permits are not required. The bag limit is one deer and regulations for deer permit area 285 apply. This is special hunt 987;
R. portions of Lake Vermilion-Soudan Underground Mine State Park and portions of the city of Tower are open November 30 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. No more than ten permits shall be issued. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 988;
S. portions of the city of Hoyt Lakes are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. The city shall issue no more than 25 permits. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 989;
T. portions of the city of Owatonna are open November 2 through December 20 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks in an earn-a-buck hunt. The city shall issue no more than 30 permits. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 990;
U. East Minnesota River Refuge in Blue Earth and LeSueur Counties is open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. Permits to hunt are unlimited, but hunters must apply before hunting. The bag limit is two deer. This is special hunt 991;
V. portions of the city of Hallock are open September 14 through December 12 for taking antlerless deer only. The city shall issue no more than 15 permits. The bag limit is two deer. This is special hunt 992;
W. portions of the city of Cook are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. The city shall issue no more than 25 permits. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 993;
X. Camp Ripley Military Reservation in Morrison County is open October 9 and 10 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. No more than 150 permits shall be issued only to Minnesota residents who have served in any branch of the United States armed forces. The bag limit is two deer. This is special hunt 994;
Y. portions of the city of Grand Rapids are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. Permits to hunt are unlimited. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 995;
Z. portions of French Township near Side Lake in St. Louis County identified on maps provided by the hunt administrator are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. No more than 30 permits shall be issued. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 996;

AA. portions of the city of Red Lake Falls are open September 14 through
December 31 for taking antlerless deer only. No more than ten permits shall be issued. The bag limit is one deer. This is special hunt 998;

BB. portions of the city of Lake Benton are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks in an earn-a-buck hunt. The city shall issue no more than 40 permits. The bag limit is two deer. This is special hunt 924;
CC. portions of the city of Aitkin are open September 14 through 29 for taking antlerless deer only. The city shall issue no more than 30 permits. The bag limit is three deer. This is special hunt 964;

DD. portions of the city of Aurora are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. The city shall issue no more than 15 permits. The bag limit is three deer. This is special hunt 898;

EE. portions of the city of Blue Earth are open September 14 through December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks in a double earn-a-buck hunt. Hunters must register two antlerless deer before harvesting a legal buck. The city shall issue no more than 20 permits. The bag limit is three deer. This is special hunt 897;

FF. portions of the city of Two Harbors are open September 14 through November 30 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks in an earn-a-buck hunt. The city shall issue no more than 20 permits. The bag limit is two deer. This is special hunt 896; and

GG. portions of the Minnesota Landscape Arboretum in Carver County are open November 1 through 10 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks in an earn-a-buck hunt. No more than five permits shall be issued. The bag limit is two deer. This is special hunt 895.

### 6232.0900 CAMP RIPLEY ARCHERY HUNT.

[For text of subparts 1 and 2, see Minnesota Rules]

Subp. 3. $\mathbf{2 0 1 9}$ special hunts. Camp Ripley is open for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. No more than 2,000 permits shall be issued for each two-day hunting period:
A. October 17 and 18 . This is special hunt 970 ; and
B. October 26 and 27. This is special hunt 971.

Subp. 4. Bag limits. The bag limit for the Camp Ripley archery hunts is two deer.

### 6232.1000 APPLICATION PROCESS FOR CAMP RIPLEY ARCHERY HUNT.

## [For text of subparts 1 to 3, see Minnesota Rules]

Subp. 4. Undersubscribed hunting periods. In hunting periods with fewer applicants than available permits, the remaining available permits must be offered on a first-come, first-served basis. An eligible person must apply individually and either in person at an ELS-POS agent location or online through the ELS-Internet system to obtain a remaining available permit. Individuals who purchase the remaining available permits retain their accumulated preference. The application requirements in subpart 3, items A, B, C, and E, apply. Undersubscribed permits shall be sold under this subpart beginning at noon on August 30 until all permits are sold or until October 4, 2019, whichever comes first.

### 6232.1300 SEASONS FOR TAKING DEER BY FIREARMS.

Subpart 1. 100 Series. This subpart applies to Deer may be taken by firearms in deer permit areas 100 to 199. Legal bueks may be taken for a 16-day period beginning the Saturday nearest November 6. In managed or intensive deer permit areas, antlerless deer may be taken throughout this season. In lottery deer permit areas and in special humt areas, antlerless deer may be taken only by permit throughout this season and only within the deer permit or special hent area speeified on each hunter's permit, exeept as speeifieally authorized by statute. A person who is authorized by statute to take a deer of either sex without an either-sex permit and who is lieensed for season option A may take an antlerless deer without a permit, except in those lottery deer permit areas where no either-sex permits are offered
and in youth-only antlerless deer permit areas. The bag limits under part 6232.0300, subpart 8 , for the corresponding deer permit area designation under part 6232.1750 apply.

Subp. 2. 200 Series. This subpart applies to Deer may be taken by firearms in deer permit areas 200 to 299. Legal bueks may be taken for a nine-day period beginning the Saturday nearest November 6. In managed or intensive deer permit areas, antlerless deer may be taken throughout this season. In lottery deer permit areas and in special humt areas, antlerless deer may be taken only by permit throughout this season and only within the deer permit or special hunt area specified on each hunter's permit, except as specifically authorized by statute. A person who is authorized by statute to take a deer of either sex without an either-sex permit and who is licensed for season option 1 may take an antlerless deer without a permit, except in those lottery deer permit areas where no either-sex permits are offered and in youth-only antlerless deer permit areas. The bag limits under part 6232.0300, subpart 8 , for the corresponding deer permit area designation under part 6232.1750 apply.

## Subp. 3. 300 Series.

A. This subpart applies to deer permit areas 300 to 399 . Item B applies to seasen option A. Item C applies to season option B.
B. Legal bucks Deer may be taken by firearms in season option A for a seven-day nine-day period beginning the Saturday nearest November 6. In managed or intensive deer permit areas, antlerless deer may be taken throughout this season. In lottery deer permit areas and in special hunt areas, antlerless deer may be taken only by permit throughout this season and only within the deer permit or special hunt area specified on each humter's permit, exeept as speeiffieally authorized by statute. A person who is authorized by statute to take a deer of either sex without an either-sex permit and who is licensed for season option $A$ may take an antlerless deer without a permit, exeept in those lottery deer permit areas where no either-sex permits are offered and in youth-only antlerless deer permit areas. The bag
limits under part 6232.0300 , subpart 8 , for the corresponding deer permit area designation under part 6232.1750 apply.
C. Legal bucks Deer may be taken by firearms in season option B for a nine-day period beginning the Saturday nearest November 20. In managed or intensive deer permit areas, antlerless deer may be taken throughout this season. In lottery deer permit areas and in special hunt areas, antlerless deer may be taken only by permit throughout this season and only within the deer permit or special hunt area specified on each hunter's permit, except as specifically authorized by statute. B. Eligible persons 12 years of older may enter the preference drawing by supplying their driver's license number, official state of Minnesota identification number, or 13 -digit firearms safety identification number on the application, except that resident hunters under age 16 on the Saturday nearest November 6 may not apply for either-sex permits.
C. All applicants who have reached their 18th birthday by the first Thursday following Labor Day must provide one of these three the identification numbers in item B to qualify to enter the preference drawing.
D. Applicants under 18 years of age who do not submit one of these the identification numbers will be assigned a number and will be entered into the preference drawing.
E. Applicants establish a preference rating based upon the number of times they have applied in previous years and have not obtained an either-sex or special hunt area permit.
F. The An applicant's preference rating will inerease increases each year the applicant applies unsuccessfully for either an either-sex or special hunt area permit.
(1) Persons applying for the first time have no preference.
(2) Applicants receiving either-sex or special hunt area permits lose their accrued preference.

### 6232.1970 TAKING DEER BY ARCHERY, FIREARMS, OR MUZZLELOADER UNDER EARLY ANTLERLESS PERMITS.

Subpart 1. Purchase. A person who purchases and presents a license valid for the archery, firearm, or muzzleloader season may purchase up to two five early antlerless permits. Early antlerless permits may be purchased for one-quarter the cost of a regular license from electronic license system agents, the Department of Natural Resources License Center, and other authorized agents.

Subp. 2. Restrictions. For the early antlerless season, hunters must have an archery license, a firearms license valid for any season option, or a muzzleloader license. Up to five early antlerless permits may be used to take antlerless deer by archery, firearms, or
muzzleloader in deer permit areas as prescribed in part 6232.1750, item G. At least one early antlerless permit must be purehased in possession to participate in the season and bonus permits may be used. Deer must be taken with the equipment authorized by the license in possession. The bag limit is five deer.

Subp. 3. Disease management exemptions. A person who purchases a disease management permit under part 6232.1980, subpart 2, may participate in the early antlerless season in deer permit areas $604,643,645,646,647,648,649$, and 655 as described in part 6232.4700 without first purchasing an early antlerless permit.

The bag limit is two deer. Middle River Veterans Outdoors is the sponsor; and
L. portions of McCarthy Beach State Park in St. Louis County are open October 24 through 26 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks by legal firearms or archery. No more than ten permits shall be issued. The bag limit is one deer. Access North is the sponsor.

### 6232.2560 YOUTH SPECIAL DEER SEASONS.

Subpart 1. Requirements. Youths participating in youth special deer seasons must obtain a license for taking deer by firearms, valid for any season option, by the beginning date of the special season. A youth special season participant may take ene deer, which must be antlerless according to the bag limits under part 6232.0300, subpart 8, for the corresponding deer permit area designation under part 6232.1750 . One bonus permit may be used. Any legal buck taken during the youth special deer season applies to the statewide limit for legal bucks prescribed in part 6232.0300, subpart 8. An adult mentor age 18 or older authorized by the youth's parent or guardian must accompany the youth hunter youth hunters ages ten to 13 at all times during the hunt. The accompanying adult may not hunt except when hunting in an early antlerless deer permit area. Party hunting is not allowed. The blaze orange or pink requirements in Minnesota Statutes, section 97B.071, paragraph (a), apply to all hunters and trappers, and all adult mentors of youth hunters, in the areas open to firearms deer hunting during the youth special seasons established in this part.

Subp. 2. Open areas; date. The Whitewater Game Refuge and all deer permit areas open to firearms deer hunting during the statewide A and B seasons, except Itasca State Park in deer permit area 287, are also open for the youth special deer season to youth who are at least ten years of age and under 18 years of age at the time of the hunt. Dates for the $\underline{2019}$ youth special deer season are October 17 through 20.

EFFECTIVE PERIOD. The expedited emergency amendments to Minnesota Rules, parts 6232.0200, $6232.0300,6232.0350,6232.0400,6232.0800,6232.0900,6232.1000,6232.1300$, 6232.1600, $6232.1750,6232.1800,6232.1970,6232.1980,6232.2100,6232.2500,6232.2560$, and 6232.4700, expire January 31, 2020. After the emergency amendments expire, the permanent rules again take effect as they read before the emergency amendments were
adopted, subject to any permanent rule amendments that were adopted while the emergency amendments were effective.
