Mille Lacs Lake and associated tributaries special management 1.5 regulations. 1.6 A. The angling season for northern pike begins at 12:01 a.m. May 9, 2020, and 1.7 continues to 11:59 p.m. March 31, 2021. While a person is on or fishing in Mille Lacs Lake 1.8 or its associated tributaries to the posted boundaries, the possession limit for northern pike 1.9 is three. All northern pike in possession must be less than 24 30 inches in length or greater 1.10 than 36 inches in length. All northern pike that are 24 to 36 30 inches or greater in length, 1.11 inclusive, must be immediately returned to the water. A person's possession limit may not 1.12 include more than one northern pike over 36 inches in length. 1.13 B. The possession limit for smallmouth bass is one. While a person is on or fishing 1.14 1.15 in Mille Lacs Lake or its associated tributaries to the posted boundaries, all smallmouth bass in possession must be 21 inches or greater in length. All smallmouth bass less than 21 1.16 inches in length must be immediately returned to the water. Unless otherwise authorized 1.17 by special permits for fishing tournaments, the angling season for largemouth and smallmouth 1.18 bass begins at 12:01 a.m. May 9, 2020, and continues to 11:59 p.m. February 28, 2021. All 1.19 largemouth and smallmouth bass caught before the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend 1.20 must be immediately returned to the water. Beginning at 12:01 a.m. September 14, 2020, 1.21 all smallmouth bass must be immediately returned to the water. While a person is on or 1.22 fishing in Mille Lacs Lake or its associated tributaries to the posted boundaries, the possession 1.23 limit for largemouth and smallmouth bass in aggregate is three. All largemouth and 1.24 smallmouth bass in possession must be less than 17 inches in length. All largemouth and 1.25 smallmouth bass that are 17 inches or greater in length must be immediately returned to the 1.26

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2.1	water. The commissioner must grant a waiver of the size, possession, and season restrictions
2.2	for largemouth and smallmouth bass under this item for a limited number of bass-fishing
2.3	tournaments each year if the commissioner determines that the tournament is in the public

2.5	to grant a waiver, the commissioner must consider the:
