3.8	Subpart 1. Spring license application drawings Special turkey hunts.
3.9	A. Applications for spring hunts to hunt the Mille Lacs, Carlos Avery, or
3.10	Whitewater Wildlife Management Areas must be made according to this part and according
3.11	to application instructions provided by the commissioner. Each person must apply at an
3.12	electronic license system agent or the Department of Natural Resources License Center.
3.13	Drawings will be conducted by the department to determine persons who will be eligible
3.14	to purchase licenses for each season hunt in the specified wildlife management areas during
3.15	periods A to C. The drawings will be subject to the quotas established by the commissioner.
3.16	Preference in the respective drawings is given to applicants based upon the number of times
3.17	they have correctly applied for a license for that hunt one of the specified wildlife
3.18	management areas but have been unsuccessful. A person selected by the drawings is
3.19	Successful applicants are eligible to purchase a license to hunt turkey in the wildlife
3.20	management area they selected during the period indicated on their turkey-hunting license.
3.21	Successful applicants may also hunt in areas that are otherwise open to spring turkey hunting.
3.22	Upon issuance of a turkey license for the spring season permit to hunt one of the specified
3.23	wildlife management areas, all accumulated preference for that season is lost, except as
3.24	provided in subpart 6.
3.25	B. No <u>lottery</u> application is needed to purchase a <u>spring or</u> fall turkey license.
3.26	C. Only successful applicants will be notified.

4.2	once for a hunt, whether as an individual or as a member of a group. Qualifying individuals
4.3	may apply for the resident landowner-tenant turkey drawing. All of the information in items
4.4	A to $G \underline{F}$ must be supplied on the application forms.

4.10	group with the lowest preference. Group applications may be made up of all general or all
4.11	landowner-tenant applications, but not both.
4.12	D. A person who applies as a landowner or tenant but does not meet the definition
4.13	as provided by this part will be ineligible for that season's drawings.
4.14	E. D. The application deadline for the spring season is the second Friday in January
4.15	February.
4.16	F. E. Youth age 17 and younger may purchase a wild turkey hunting license to
4.17	hunt all eight spring turkey time periods. A wild turkey hunting license under this item is
4.18	separate from the normal lottery process and is valid for hunting in any wild turkey permit
4.19	area.
4.20	G. F. A person who has not applied for a wild turkey license through the lottery
4.21	or who applied for a license and was unsuccessful in the lottery may purchase a wild turkey
4.22	hunting license to hunt the spring turkey season during the fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, or
4.23	eighth time period. A wild turkey hunting license under this item is separate from the normal
4.24	lottery process. Firearms hunters who purchase a license under this item age 18 and older
