Subpart 1. **Open season.** Fisher and pine marten may be taken by trapping from the first Saturday following Thanksgiving, December 9, to the Sunday nearest, December 12.

Subp. 2. **Bag limits.** The combined limit for fisher and pine marten is <u>five two</u> per season, in aggregate. A person may not take more than <u>five two</u> fisher and pine marten, combined, per season or possess more than <u>five two</u> fisher and pine marten, combined, at a time, except that a person may possess additional pelts that the person lawfully took, tagged, and registered during previous seasons.
