1.5	Subpart 1. Open hunting. The Becklin Homestead Park Wildlife Management Area
1.6	is open to hunting and trapping during the established seasons only to hunters and trappers
1.7	with disabilities and their able-bodied partners during:
1.8	A. disabled hunters and trappers who meet the requirements of the established
1.9	seasons according to Minnesota Statutes, section 97B.055, subdivision 3, paragraphs (a)
1.10	and (b)-; and

1.12	Subp. 2. Special hunt.
1.13	A. The Becklin Homestead Park Wildlife Management Area is open September
1.14	14 to December 31 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks by archery as described in this
1.15	subpart. No more than 20 permits shall be issued to hunters with disabilities. Capable Partners
1.16	is the sponsor and hunters with disabilities and able-bodied partners must meet any
1.17	requirements of the sponsoring organization. Hunters with disabilities and able-bodied
1.18	partners may use bonus tags. This is special hunt 882.
1.19	B. Hunters with disabilities must be accompanied by an able-bodied partner each
1.20	time they hunt. Hunters with disabilities must purchase and possess an archery deer-hunting
1.21	license. The bag limit for hunters with disabilities is two deer, one of which may be a legal

4.2	A. A party is a group of two or more licensed deer hunters who are afield hunting
4.3	together and are all using firearms or all using archery equipment.
4.4	B. A member of a party may kill a legal buck or antlerless deer for another member
4.5	of the party who has an unused tag valid for that deer, except:
4.6	A. as provided by Minnesota Statutes, section 97B.301; and.
4.7	B. in all 300 series deer permit areas as prescribed in part 6232.1300, subpart 3,
4.8	where unused tags can be used on antlerless deer only.
4.9	C. A mixed-weapons group is considered two separate parties.

5.5	muzzleloader special hunts, including early- or late-season hunts.

5.7	must validate the tag a site tag must be validated at the site of kill by the licensed deer hunter
5.8	whose tag is being used on the deer. Validation consists of using a knife or similar sharp

5.18	during the archery season, the firearms season, and the muzzleloader season, but not more
5.19	than three legal bucks per calendar year. A person may not tag more than one deer during

5.21	A. B. In deer permit areas designated as managed or intensive two-deer limit,

7.17	A. Registration agents are not required to inspect deer at registration stations.

7.20	B. No part of the carcass, except skin or entrails, may be removed until after the
7.21	deer has been registered using one of the methods described in subpart 2, except that deer
7.22	may be quartered prior to registration as long as all parts remain together and are presented
7.23	for registration and the head of the deer remains attached to one quarter. A person may not

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process a deer unless it has been registered as evidenced by a possession tag or registration confirmation number.

<u>C.</u> <u>Authorized department staff may transport carcasses statewide when conducting</u> department operations.

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Subp. 6. Deer carcasses in chronic wasting disease management zone.

A. Except as provided in items B, D, E, F, G, I, J, and K, carcasses of wild deer harvested by hunters, killed by vehicles, or killed in any other manner in a chronic wasting disease management zone must remain in the zone until the results of a test for chronic wasting disease show the disease has not been detected in the deer.

- B. Cut and wrapped meat, quarters, or other portions of meat from a deer taken in the chronic wasting disease early detection management zone may be transported outside the zone if no part of the spinal column or head is attached. Antlers, hides, teeth, finished taxidermy mounts, antlers attached to skull caps that are cleaned of all brain tissue, and whole skulls that are cleaned of all brain tissue may be transported outside the chronic wasting disease early detection management zone.
- C. Except as provided in item G, deer, except fawns, taken on November 9 or 10, 2024, in the chronic wasting disease management zone must be submitted at a designated sampling station listed on the Department of Natural Resources website for chronic wasting disease sampling within 24 hours of harvest and before transporting out of the chronic wasting disease management zone.
- D. Carcasses of deer taken in deer permit areas 642, 643, 644, 645, 646, 647, 648, 649, and 655, as defined in part 6232.4700, subparts 95, 96, 97, 98, 99, 100, 101, 102, and 164, may be transported from those deer permit areas into incorporated and unincorporated

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municipal boundaries of the following cities: Adams, Elkton, Dexter, Kasson, Lake City	<u>y,</u>
Mantorville, Oronoco, Pine Island, South Troy, and Zumbro Falls.	
E. Carcasses of deer taken in deer permit area 661 as defined in part 6232.470)0,
subpart 104, may be transported from deer permit area 661 into the incorporated and	
unincorporated municipal boundaries of the following cities: Alvarado, Angus, Beltram	i,
Crookston, Euclid, Nielsville, Oslo, and Warren.

H. Hunters who are submitting samples via the department hunter mail-in samp	ple
program rather than at a check station must have their samples postmarked within 72 hou	ars
of harvest. Hunters must obtain mail-in kits before taking the deer to comply with the	
sampling requirement.	
I. Enrolled members of Minnesota Tribal governments, as defined under Minnesota	ota
Statutes, section 10.65, subdivision 2, paragraph (a), clause (4), who take deer on lands he	elc
in trust by the Minnesota Tribal government that the member is enrolled in are exempt fro	om

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this subpart.

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J. Heads from cervids with or without the cape and neck attached that originate from outside Minnesota may be transported into Minnesota only if they are delivered to a licensed taxidermist within 48 hours of entering Minnesota.

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K. Heads from cervids with or without the cape and neck attached that originate inside the chronic wasting disease management zone may be transported out of the chronic wasting disease management zone only if they are delivered to a licensed taxidermist within 48 hours of leaving the chronic wasting disease management zone.

Subp. 7. Deer carcasses in chronic wasting disease surveillance zone.

- A. Except as provided in items B and C, deer, except fawns, taken on November 9 or 10, 2024, in the chronic wasting disease surveillance zone must be submitted at a designated sampling station listed on the Department of Natural Resources website for chronic wasting disease sampling within 24 hours of harvest.
- B. Hunters who are submitting samples via the department hunter mail-in sample program rather than at a check station must have their samples postmarked within 72 hours of harvest. Hunters must obtain mail-in kits before taking the deer to comply with the sampling requirement.
- C. Enrolled members of a Minnesota Tribal government, as defined by Minnesota Statutes, section 10.65, subdivision 2, paragraph (a), clause (4), who take deer on lands held in trust by the Minnesota Tribal government they are enrolled in are exempt from this subpart.

Subp. 8. Deer taken during disease management hunts.

A. Except as provided in items B and C and within 24 hours after the hunt ends, deer, except fawns, taken during a disease management hunt under part 6232.1600, subpart 9, must be submitted for mandatory testing for chronic wasting disease at a designated 10.25 sampling station listed on the Department of Natural Resources website.

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B. Hunters who are submitting samples via the department hunter mail-in sample program rather than at a check station must have their samples postmarked within 72 hours of harvest. Hunters must obtain mail-in kits before taking the deer to comply with the sampling requirement.

C. Enrolled members of a Minnesota Tribal government, as defined by Minnesota Statutes, section 10.65, subdivision 2, paragraph (a), clause (4), who take deer on lands held in trust by the Minnesota Tribal government they are enrolled in are exempt from this subpart.

6232.0700 LEGAL DEER BY ARCHERY.

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Antlerless deer and legal bucks may be taken by archery, except that archery hunters may not take antlerless deer in <u>lottery bucks-only</u> deer permit areas that have no either-sex permit quota or in <u>antlerless lottery</u> deer permit areas that have a quota of youth antlerless permits for firearms deer hunters under part 6232.1800.

6232.0800 ARCHERY SPECIAL HUNT AREAS AND PROCEDURES.

[For text of subpart 1, see Minnesota Rules]

Subp. 2. Areas. Archery special bow and arrow hunt permits are valid in areas designated by the commissioner and published in the annual hunting regulations booklet. Unless otherwise specified, hunters must possess a valid archery special hunt permit for the archery special hunt areas under this subpart. In addition to complying with the requirements of this part, hunters who are hunting under an archery special hunt permit must meet any requirements of the municipality, park, or area in which the special hunt occurs and of any sponsoring organization. Hunt participants must stay within any boundaries that are prescribed by the sponsoring organization, by maps provided during a prehunt orientation, or by posting. The following archery special hunt areas are established for the 2024 season:

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12.1	A. portions of the Pin Oak Prairie Scientific and Natural Area in Fillmore County
12.2	are open October 1 to November 30 for taking antlerless deer and legal bucks. No more
12.3	than eight permits shall be issued. The bag limit is five deer. This is special hunt 926;
12.4	B. portions of Carleton State Game Refuge and Arboretum in Dakota and Rice
12.5	Counties are open November 28 to December 31 for antlerless deer and legal bucks in an

An adult mentor age 18 or older authorized by the youth's parent or guardian must accompany the youth hunter hunters ages ten to 13 at all times during the hunt. The accompanying adult may not hunt, except when hunting in an early antlerless deer permit area. Party hunting is not allowed. The blaze orange or pink requirements in Minnesota Statutes, section 97B.071, paragraph (a), apply to all hunters and trappers, and all adult mentors of youth hunters, in the areas open to firearms deer hunting during the youth special seasons established in this part.
