

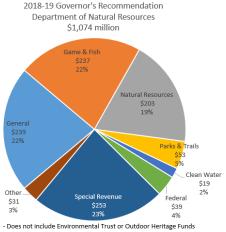
This budget maintains and improves Minnesota's world-class natural resources and outdoor recreation opportunities. It provides total funding for the DNR of \$1.074 billion in FY2018-19. This increases funding by \$76 million (8%) and continues \$72 million funding from Legacy Funds. This is offset by \$40 million in revenues, which mostly relate to user fee increases.

While 100 percent of this request advances our mission and helps ensure that we are meeting the expectations of Minnesotans, 87 percent of the new requests restore lost program capacity and maintain our current level of services while 13 percent invest strategically in new initiatives. The significant need to restore and maintain reflects the real impacts of growing budget pressures the department has faced over the last few biennia. (See page two for additional detail.)

The Governor proposes \$40.6 million in General Fund dollars. These proposals focus maintaining and restoring parks and enforcement services, makes critical investments in state forests and provides additional funds to minimize the impacts of known and anticipated operating and legal costs.
