- Minnesota's Outdoor Recreation System -

Create high-quality outdoor recreation opportunities:

- Manage 67 state parks, 7 state recreation areas, 8 state waysides, and 54 state forest campgrounds/day use areas.
- Manage 21 state trails, encompassing 1,266 miles of developed, multi-use trails
- Manage state forest recreational trails, encompassing 1,085 miles of non-motorized trails and 2,152 miles of motorized trails
- Manage a system of water trails and recreation facilities:
 - 1,590 state water accesses
 - 30 designated canoe and boating routes, encompassing 4,350 water trail miles
 - 340 fishing piers and shorefishing sites





DNR Parks and Trails

- Serves -

- 8 million annual state park visitors
- 1.5 million Minnesotans visit a state park annually
- Ten of the state's top 35 tourism attractions are in state parks






- Water recreation users: Minnesota ranks 1st in the nation for number of boats per capita (866,000)
- Motorized recreation users: 251,000 registered snowmobiles and 264,000 registered All-Terrain Vehicles (ATVs)
- Non-motorized recreation users: Bicyclists, hikers, cross-country skiers










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DNR Parks and Trails


Strategic Objective 1: Outdoor Recreation

 Outdoor Recreation Program -Provides recreation, visitor, and support services to state park guests, state park strategic planning, marketing, maintenance of buildings, facilities and equipment, law enforcement, and products and gifts for sale at state parks








Strategic Objective 2: Natural and Cultural Resource Management

Protect, enhance, and restore natural landscapes and cultural resources

Supporting Programs:

 Natural and cultural resource management program – Provides direction and technical expertise in protecting, restoring, and managing the natural and cultural resources on 225,000 acres within state park and recreation areas









Strategic Objective 3: Conservation Education

Provide for conservation education, environmental stewardship, and outdoor skills training through activities, programs, and special events

Supporting Programs:

Conservation Education and Interpretive Program - Connects people with the outdoors and provides comprehensive programming of conservation education, outdoor skill training, interpretive activities and special events for parks visitors, communities, and schools

- Geocaching History Challenge 20,000 cache finds




Strategic Objective 4: Trails and Waterways Operations and Rehabilitation

- Safe Harbors








Strategic Objective 5: Planning, Acquisition, and Development

Plan, acquire, develop and renew land and facilities to meet recreational, environmental, safety and community needs



DNR Parks and Trails

- State Parks and Trails Legacy -

(\$6.54 million FY2010; \$13.64 million FY2011)

Parks and Trails Fund

Expected Outcomes: Provide high-quality, easy-to-access, and safe recreational opportunities to the public

Facility renewal and rehabilitation

 Create a gateway for connecting people with Minnesota's great outdoors through renewal and rehabilitation of the state park and state trail system.

Visitor services and outreach

 Provide education, interpretation, and outdoor skills training to engage people in outdoor activities, encourage natural resource stewardship, and reach out to new participants.

Resource protection

 Manage and restore natural landscapes within the state park and trail system and showcase energy efficient and environmentally-friendly operations.





- Parks and Trails Grants Program -

(\$4.13 million FY2010; \$8.62 million FY2011)

Parks and Trails Fund

Expected Outcomes

- Support regional parks and trails to meet the needs of present and future generations through grants to local units of government
- Grants for acquisition and development of regional parks and trails through an annual competitive grant application process, with local match required
- Local government recipients responsible for ongoing operations and maintenance of facilities







DNR Parks and Trails

- Water Recreation Program -

(\$1.4 million FY2010; \$1.4 million FY2011)

Natural Resources Fund



Expected Outcomes

Keep pace with changing public demand for water access facilities:

- Public water access maintenance
- Shoreline restoration
- Downloadable GPS coordinates and interpretation of river level gauge information (one-time appropriation)



- Outdoors Minnesota -

(\$470,000 FY2010; \$470,000 FY2011)

Expected Outcomes


Increase outdoor recreation participation: connect with youth and young adults, families, new participants, and underserved groups.
