



How to Plant a Balled and Burlapped Tree

- Keep root ball moist at all times. Dry roots die.
- 2 Loosen top of burlap and remove excess soil to top of first woody root.



- 3 Dig a hole two times the width of root ball and as deep as distance from bottom of root ball to top of first woody root.
- Carefully place tree in hole, making sure it stands straight and top of first woody root is at ground level.




Celebrate Arbor Month-plant trees.

FORESTRY

Backfill hole halfway up root ball and then cut and remove visible portions of wire basket and burlap without disturbing the root ball.



- Finish backfilling hole to top of first woody root, leaving no exposed burlap.
- 7 Heel in soil with foot over entire backfill area to remove air pockets from the soil.
- Water root ball and entire backfill area.
- Layer 2"-4" of mulch over backfilled area, keeping mulch away from trunk.



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
