Shallow wetlands were once abundant throughout the grasslands of southern Minnesota, and provided valuable habitat for waterfowl and upland wildlife species. Modern farming practices and drainage have lead to the disappearance of nearly all these wetland sites. This project seeks to restore a drained wetland on the Charlote Hynes WMA in Faribault County. The area to be restored is part of a larger wetland basin that extends beyond the boundaries of the WMA, therefore a dike will be constructed along the property line to contain surface flows on the state owned land. This dike will incorporate a compacted clay core to prevent seepage. A thorough search of this area will be conducted to locate sub-surface tile drainage lines, which will be blocked within the wetland area. Where these lines are conveying water from adjacent private property, they will be replaced with non-perforated tiles that will not drain water out of the wetland restoration but will continue to provide neighboring land owners with drainage. A small water control structure will be installed in the berm that will outlet water through the tile system to regulate water levels.
