Wildlife openings are small areas cleared in the forest to mimic openings that naturally occur from disturbances such as wind and fire.

They create less disturbance to the soil and native plants, require less labor and expense, provide less opportunity for invasive plants to

become introduced, and have greater plant diversity and structure.

Wildlife openings can be cleared and maintained by hand cutting, mowing, shearing, light disking, burning or selective treatment with herbicide

to periodically remove shrubs and trees, to allow sunlight to native grasses and forbs and stimulate new growth of native shrubs

Ruffed grouse, bear, deer, moose, songbirds and other wildlife will use these openings. If near young deciduous forest and dense brush such

as alder, they can provide singing grounds, feeding and roosting cover, and nesting and brood rearing habitat for woodcock.

The control of shading species through the above management will increase wildlife in the area.
