The site, adjacent to the Vermillion Highlands WMA, was acquired in 2007. The 550 acre park contains 100 acres of rented cropland, half of which is (HEL) land. Desired outcomes include: Convert all cropland to native prairie, establish oak trees in the north half of park where none exist, invasive woody species that shade out native species and reduce siltation into the park reservoir that currently provides outstanding waterfowl habitat and contributes flows to the Vermillion River trout stream.

Re: CONSERVATION PARTNERS LEGACY GRANT PROGRAM, PARTNER COMMITMENT LETTER

Dakota County, through its' Parks and Open Space Department, is submitting two grant applications to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources for funding through the Conservation Partners Legacy Grant Program. On October 20, 2009 the Dakota County Board of Commissioners passed a resolution supporting the applications, authorized the Parks and Open Space Department to apply, and directed that the projects be included in the proposed final 2010-2014 Parks and Open Space Capital Improvement Program.

The first of the two projects is located at the Lake Byllesby Regional Park and involves the restoration of about 157 acres of existing park land to oak savanna. Currently the property contains an old gravel pit, 30 acres of agricultural crops, with the balance in a degraded condition of brome grass and cedar.

The second project is located on a 2008 acquisition intended to be a new regional park. Currently called the Vermillion Highlands Regional Park, the grant request is for funds to convert about 100 acres of agricultural use to an oak savanna landscape.

Dakota County will make a 10% cash match to the grants, as well as contribute significant in-kind services. The cash match is derived from a county-funded Environment Fund intended for projects that benefit the natural environment. In-kind services such as staff time and use of county-owned equipment will be paid for from the operating budgets for the Parks and Open Space Department.

These two projects, totaling 257 acres, would greatly improve ecological conditions, habitat, and recreation for visitors to the Dakota County Parks.
