Project Information

1. Describe the local support for this project.

Landowners within this watershed have participated in and have been supportive of converting marginal lands to wetlands and habitat and they continue to support additional projects. Many of the landowners support the Martin County Conservation Club and are highly supportive of this acquisition. At least one adjacent landowner is planning to add his property to the new WMA within the next year.

2. Describe the degree of collaboration for this project.

The Martin County Conservation Club, Fox Lake Conservation League, Friends of the Windom Wetland Management District and Martin County Pheasants Forever have pledged match funds for this project. The Martin SWCD and Rural Advantage support the project that will result in the protection of native habitat. Both will provide educational efforts regarding the native plant communities and the care and maintenance of these habitats that are found on this valuable land.

3. Describe any urgency associated with this project.

The project site is a landlocked 40 with a one half mile long access included in the parcel legal description. It is at least one half mile from any public road in all directions. It is almost entirely surrounded with high quality wildlife habitat, and is highly attractive for a private hunting area. This parcel is currently available for sale and is not expected to be on the market for long.

4. Discuss if there are multiple benefits resulting from your project, identifying those species, habitats, etc.

Besides its value as a public hunting area, this site has a diverse range of wet to mesic paririe plant populations. It holds the largest population or Riddle's Goldenrod in the area and areas adjacent to the parcel hold populations of Rattlesnake Master, Wood Lily, Small White Ladyslipper and many other species that are becoming quite rare in this area.

5. Discuss the habitat benefits resulting from your project.

Existing native wetland and prairie habitat will be protected from conversion to non habitat uses. The site will add to the diversity of adjacent areas of habitat that are protected from conversion. There are species of native plants that are found on this parcel that are not found on other parcels within the general area. Other parcels that are part of the contiguous habitat associated with this parcel have some native prairie remnants. The parcel includes great habitat for waterfowl and upland game and nongame species. Shorebirds and waders can be seen in and around wetlands. Meadowlarks, Bobolinks, Dickcissel and many other species can be found in the upland areas.

6. Describe how your project is consistent with sound conservation science.

The hydorology and character of the land make it most suitable for wildlife habitat. Economically and environmentally, this project area will best serve the community by keeping conservation cover on the upland which is sandy and highly wind and water erodible. The wetlands are prone to sedimentation that would result from attemts to farm the area.

7. Indicate if your project is adjacent to protected lands, describing those lands (ownership, public access, etc.)

An adjacent parcel is enrolled in a perpetual RIM easement, Another parcel has been purchased and is in the process of being acquired by the MN DNR for the Center Creek

WMA. Another parcel is enrolled in CRP and other acres of private land are in pasture and native habitat. Most of the parcels hold high quality native plant populations. Center Creek WMA will be open to the public for hunting and trapping and private lands are available upon permission form the landowners.

- 8. Discuss if there is full funding secured for this project and the sources of funding. This grant and pledged matching funds will fully fund this project. The cash match is provided by: Martin County Conservation Club, Inc., Fox Lake Conservation League, Friends of the Windom Wetland Management District, Martin County Pheasants Forever. These four organizations have each pledged \$5,422 for a total of \$21,688.00 in cash match for this high priority acquisition project.
- **9.** Discuss if CPL Grant funds will supplement or supplant existing funding. Discuss how these CPL funds will impact your organization's current budget. CPL Grant funds will allow the purchase of a parcel that is out of reach by the organization. Grant funds will supplement existing funds to allow the project to be completed. This project is not expected to impact the organization's budget except that matching funds will be provided to accomplish the project. The organization's goal is to utilize its funding to acquire and improve habitat.
- 10. Describe public access at project site for hunting and fishing, identifying all open seasons.

Once the land has been acquired by the DNR and added to the Center Creek WMA, it is expected to be open to the public for all all hunting, trapping and fishing seasons.

11. Describe the sustainability of your project.

As a part of the Center Creek WMA, the project site would be expected to provide habitat and recreation opportunities for as long as WMAs exist. With routine maintenence this project should serve the public and provide habitat for future generations to come.

12. Discuss use of native vegetation (if applicable).

Native prairie vegetation is the predominant cover on the site, in both upland and wetland areas. Native vegetation will need to be re-established on about 10 acres that were in agricultural production. The parcel and adjacent areas will serve as a seed source for this habitat restoration work.

13. Discuss your budget and why it is cost effective.

The budget reflects a reasonable price for the acquisition of this high quality habitat. With the species diversity present on this site, even at current agricultural land prices, this parcel is still a bargain. Acquiring it now, before any the existing cover is destroyed by attempts to crop it, helps to make the project cost effective, saving dollars needed to restore part of the site, with only a few enhancements needed.

14. Describe your organization's ability to successfully complete this work, including experience in the area of interest and ability to successfully implement the proposed project. Include descriptions of your most recent grant experience and if the expected outcomes were achieved.

The Fox Lake Conservation League has provided the groundwork for several land acquisitions, funding appraisals to facilitate timely acquisitions. The League has even purchased tracts to ensure high quality habitat in priority areas did not slip away before acquisition funds could be secured. The League has partnered with the MN DNR, the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Martin SWCD and many organizations to improve habitat and acquire habitat. The League has secured grants and successfully completed the work on several grant projects.

15. Discuss how your project supports landscape level plans. Use additional sources for information if needed or available.

It supports the Martin County Water Plan goals and objectives relating to protecting and improving surface and ground water quality, ground water recharge and mitigating surface water quantity issues. It addresses water plan issues relating the establishment of wildlife habitat utilizing local ecotype native plant materials to benefit water quality and reduce sediment delivery to surface waters. Working with agencies to restore wetlands is a water plan action item.

16. Discuss how your project supports species plans. Use additional sources for information if needed or available.

It provides habitat for a broad range of remnant local ecotype native species that are in decline locally. It supports the Farm Service Agency/Natural Resources Conservation Service Local Work group initiative to provide habitat for the Blanding's Turtle which has recently been documented in Martin County. This parcel and the surrounding wetland complex holds habitat that should provide habitat for the Blanding's Turtle and many other species of game and non-game species found in the area.

17. Discuss how your project conforms to the Statewide Conservation and Preservation Plan.

It will maintain restore and expand critical land habitat, critical habitat at the land/water interface and critical in-water habitat. It will provide outdoor recreation in an area where there is a shortage of quality public hunting land. It will help promote a healthy rural economy, as visitors to the site support local businesses.

18. Discuss how your project conforms to the State Wildlife Action Plan (if applicable). The project site was reviewed in conjunction with the Minnesota Biological Survey and it has been used as a local ecotype seed source for local restoration projects. It holds habitat that is important for the recovery of rare and declining species. Acquisition of this site will result in prairie enhancement and "tomorrow's habitat for the rare and the wild". The site is close to a public school which can use it as a field trip destination.
