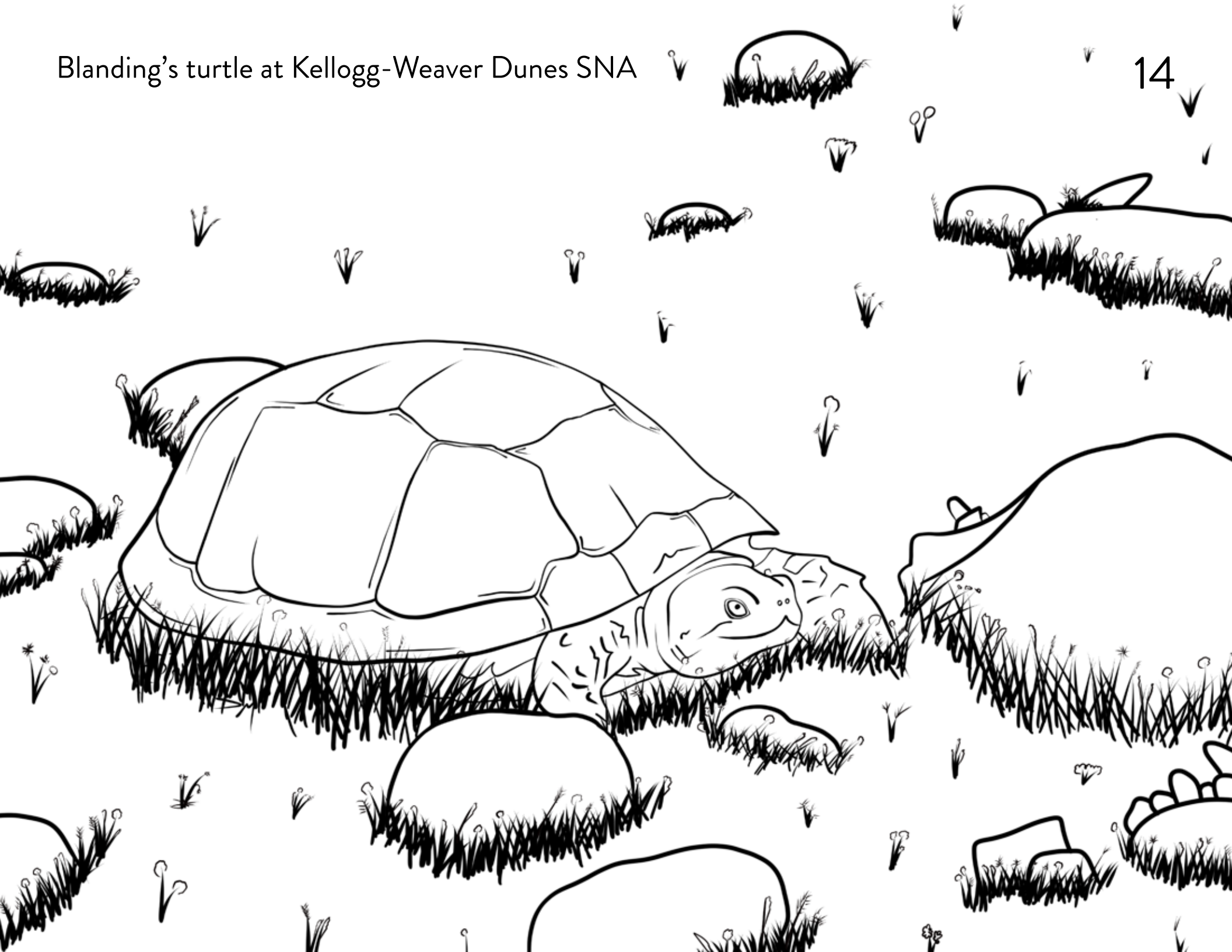


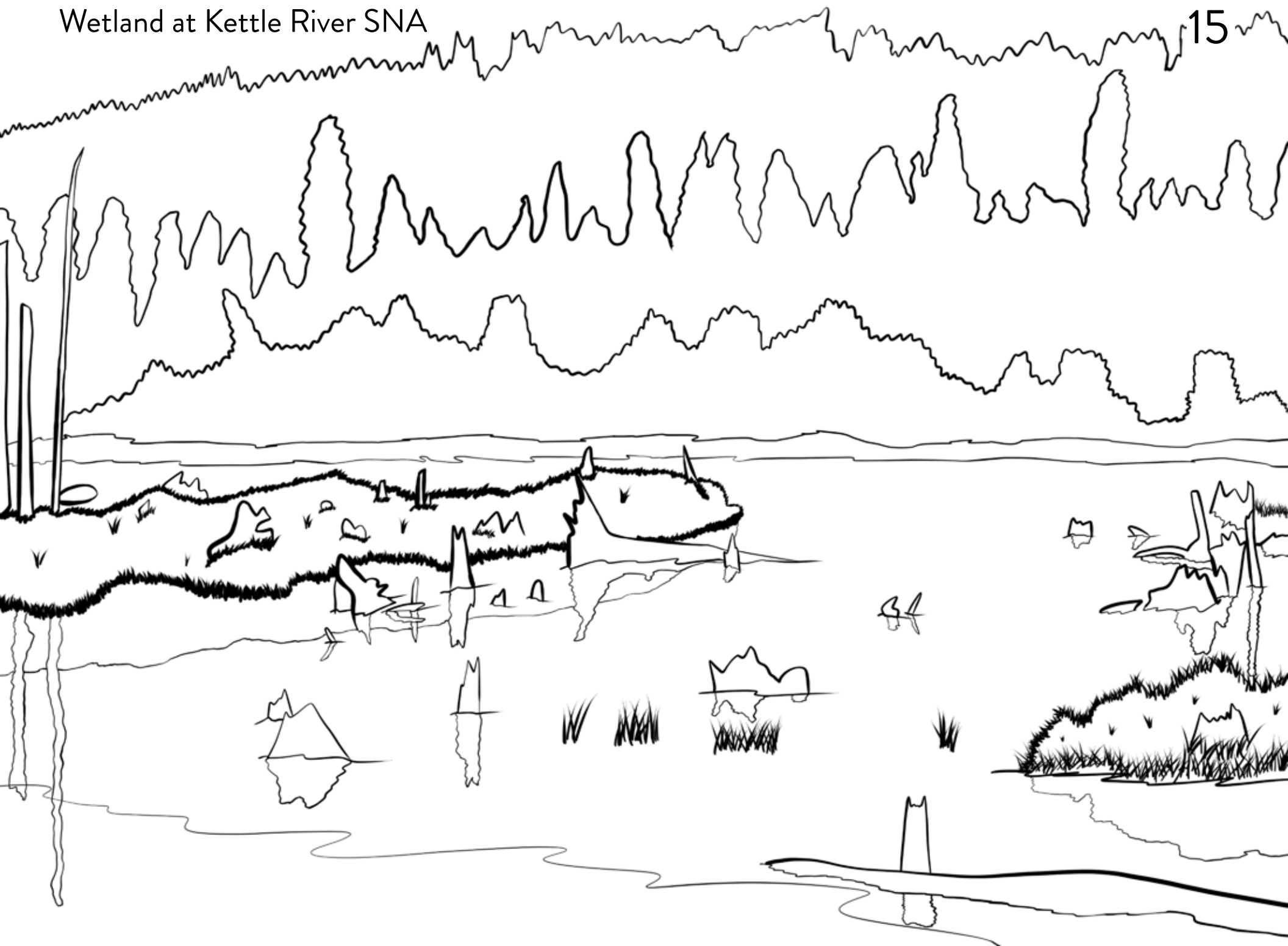








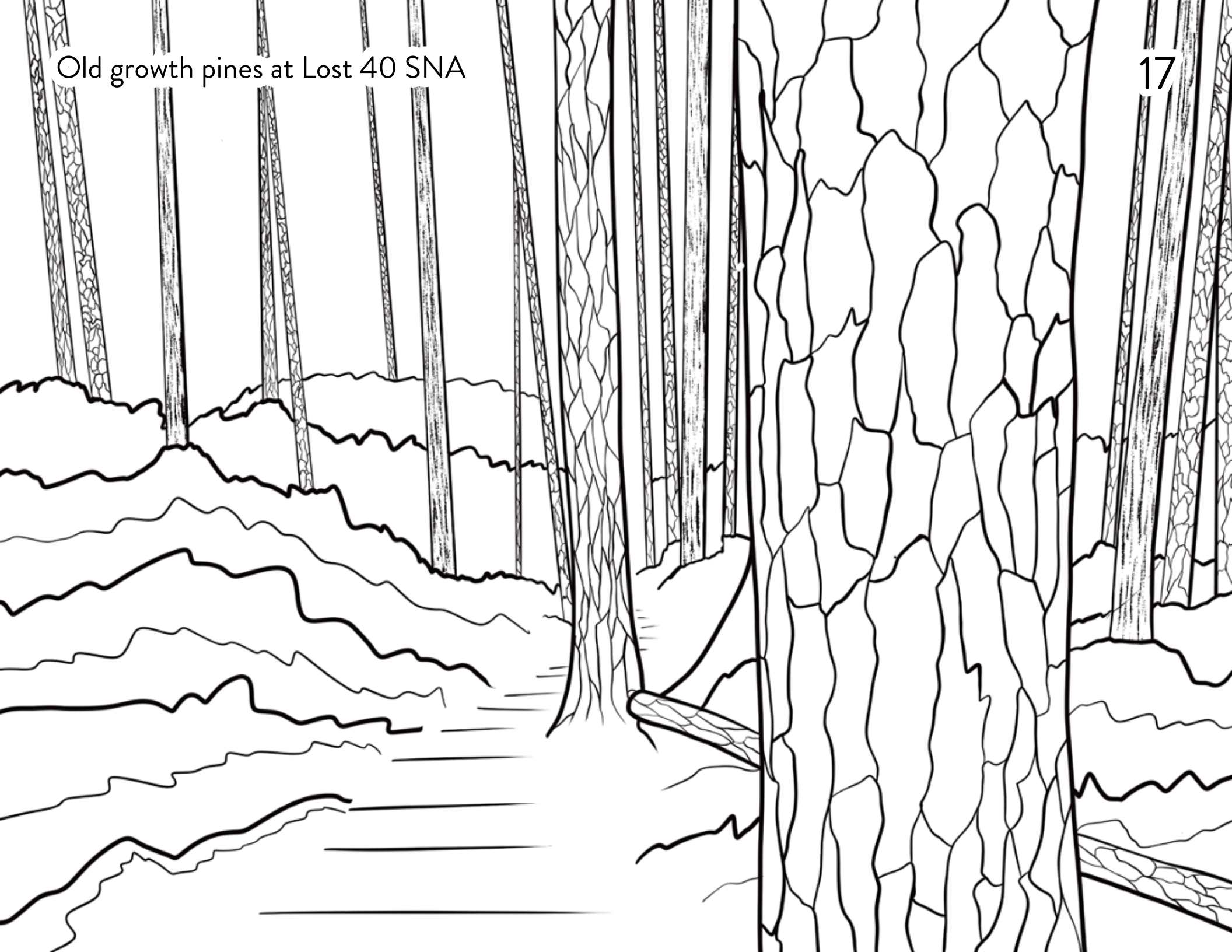


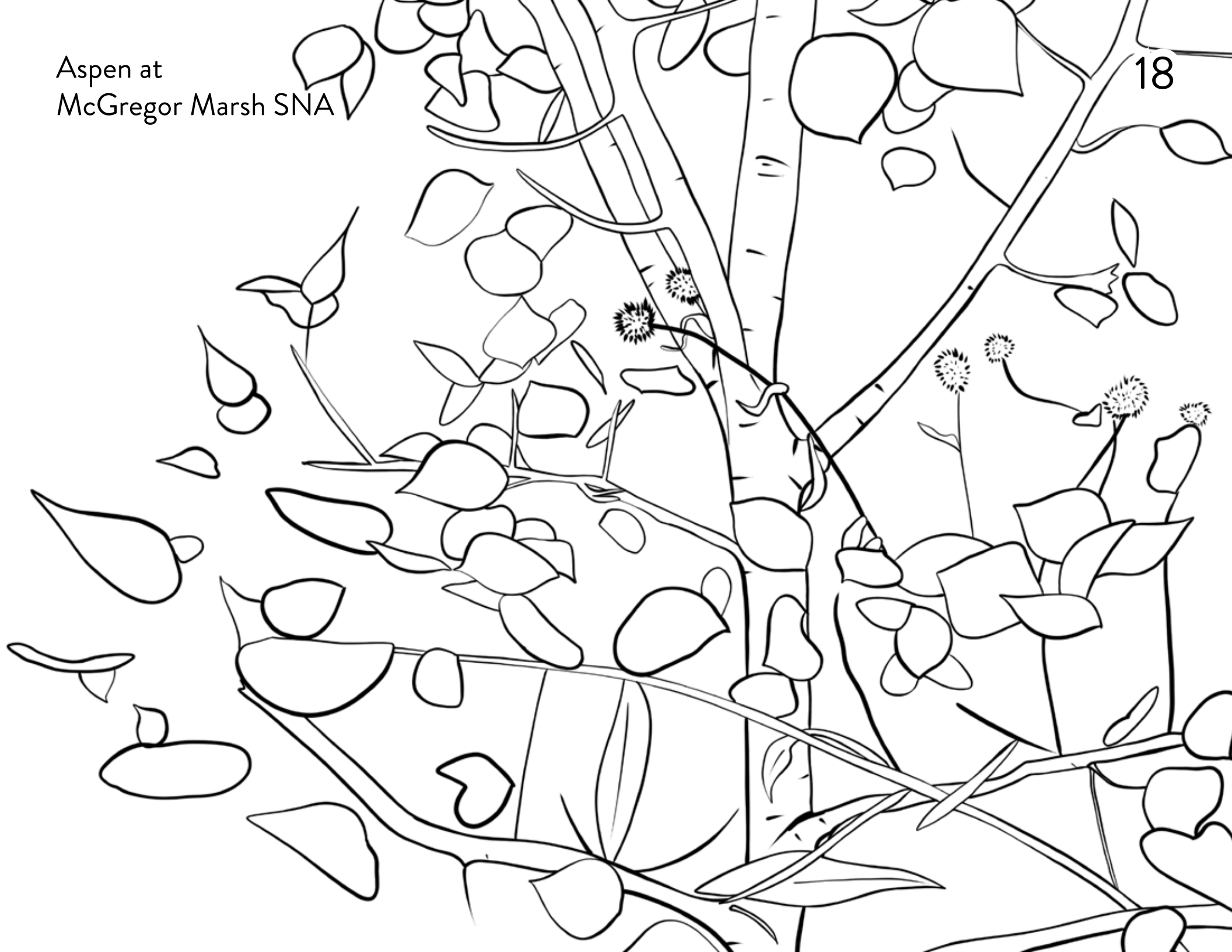


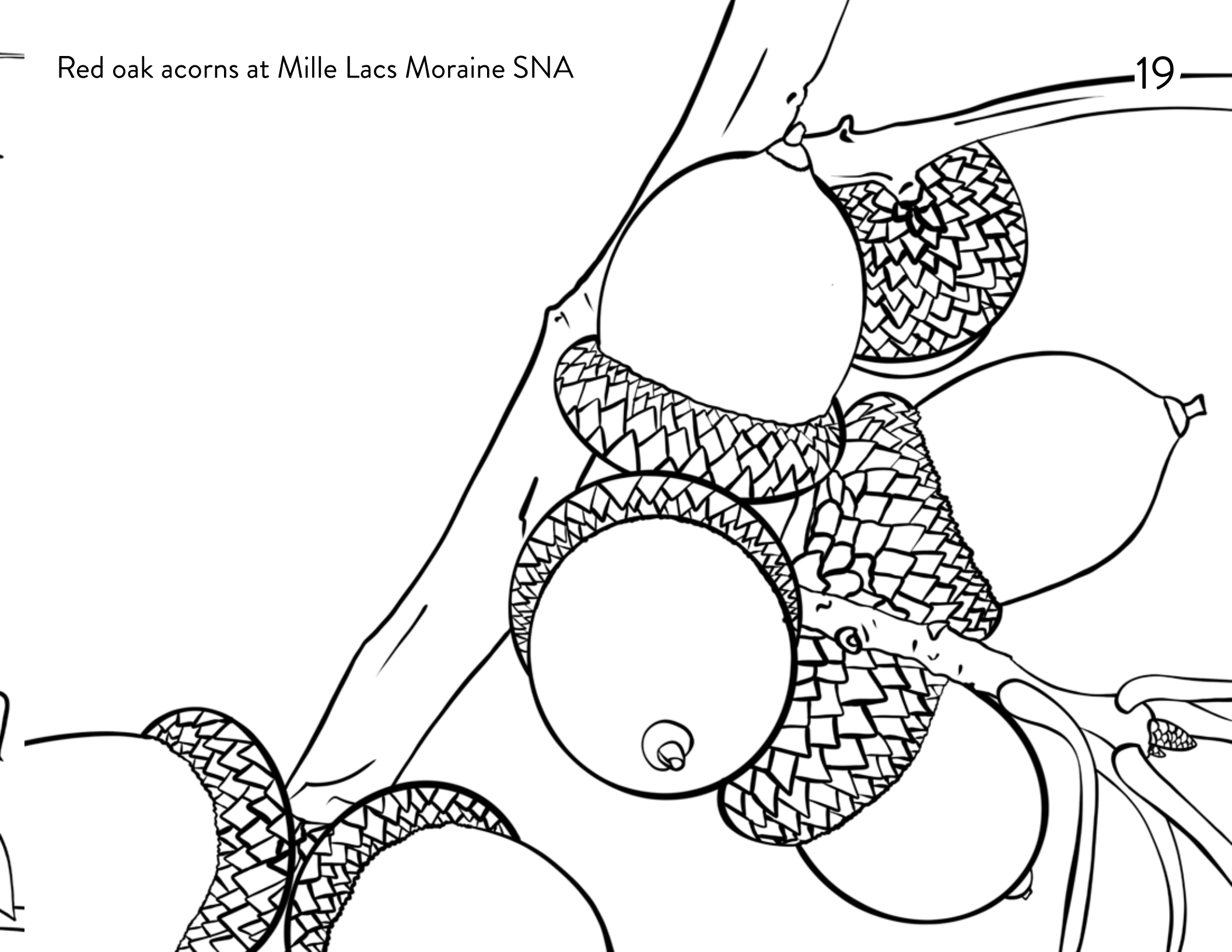


Old growth pines at Lost 40 SNA

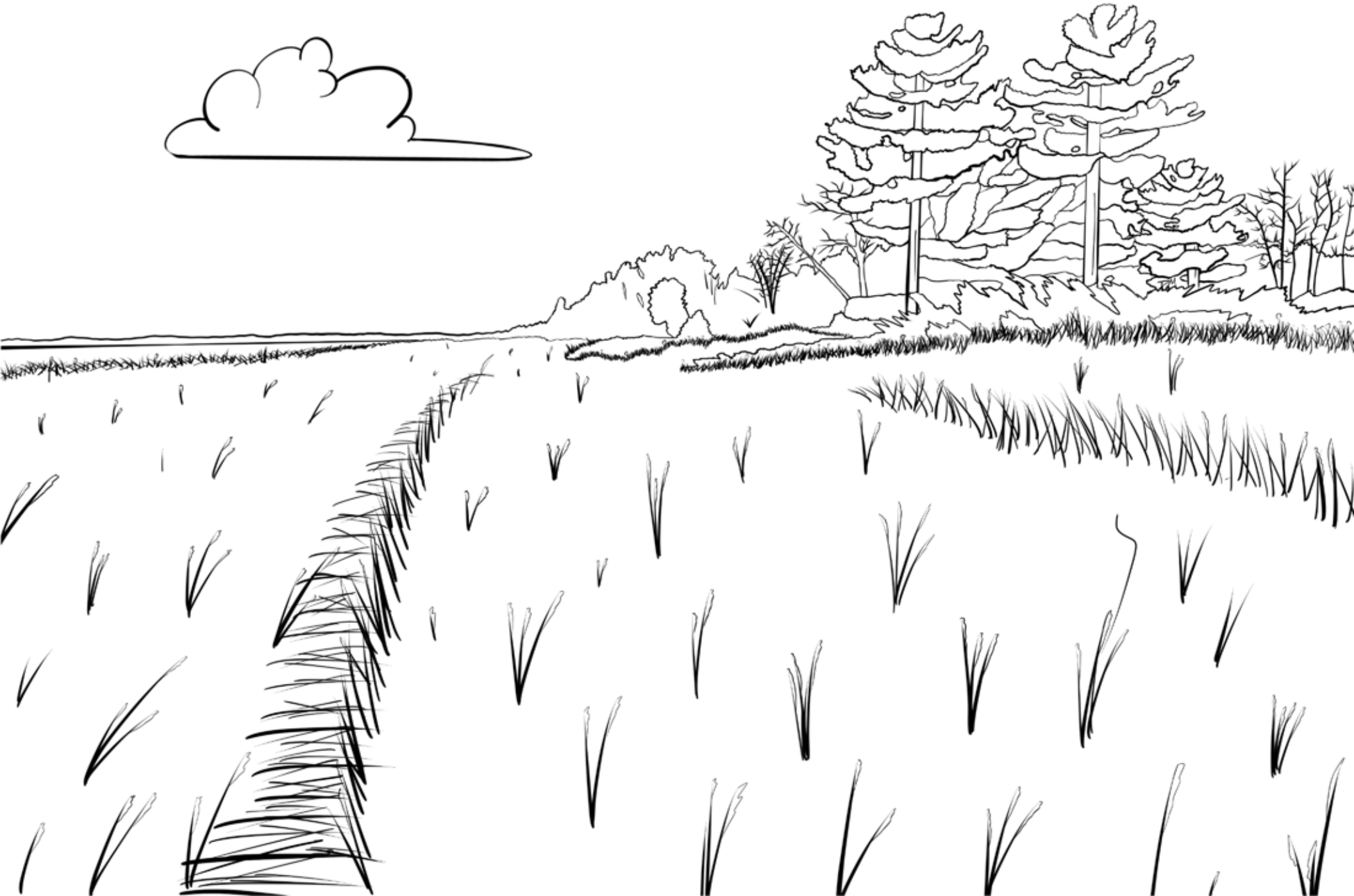






Beachgrass dune at Minnesota Point Pine Forest SNA

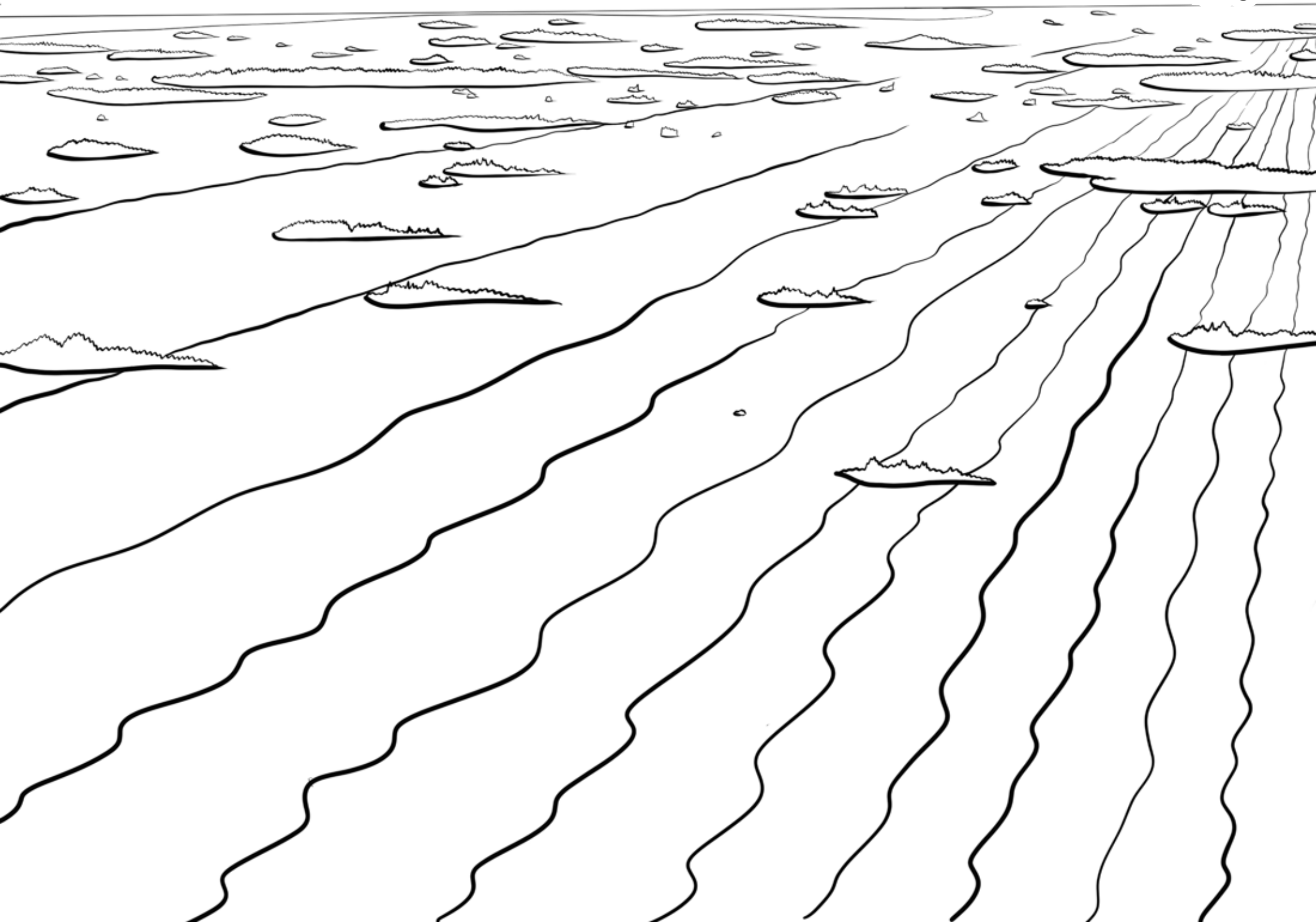










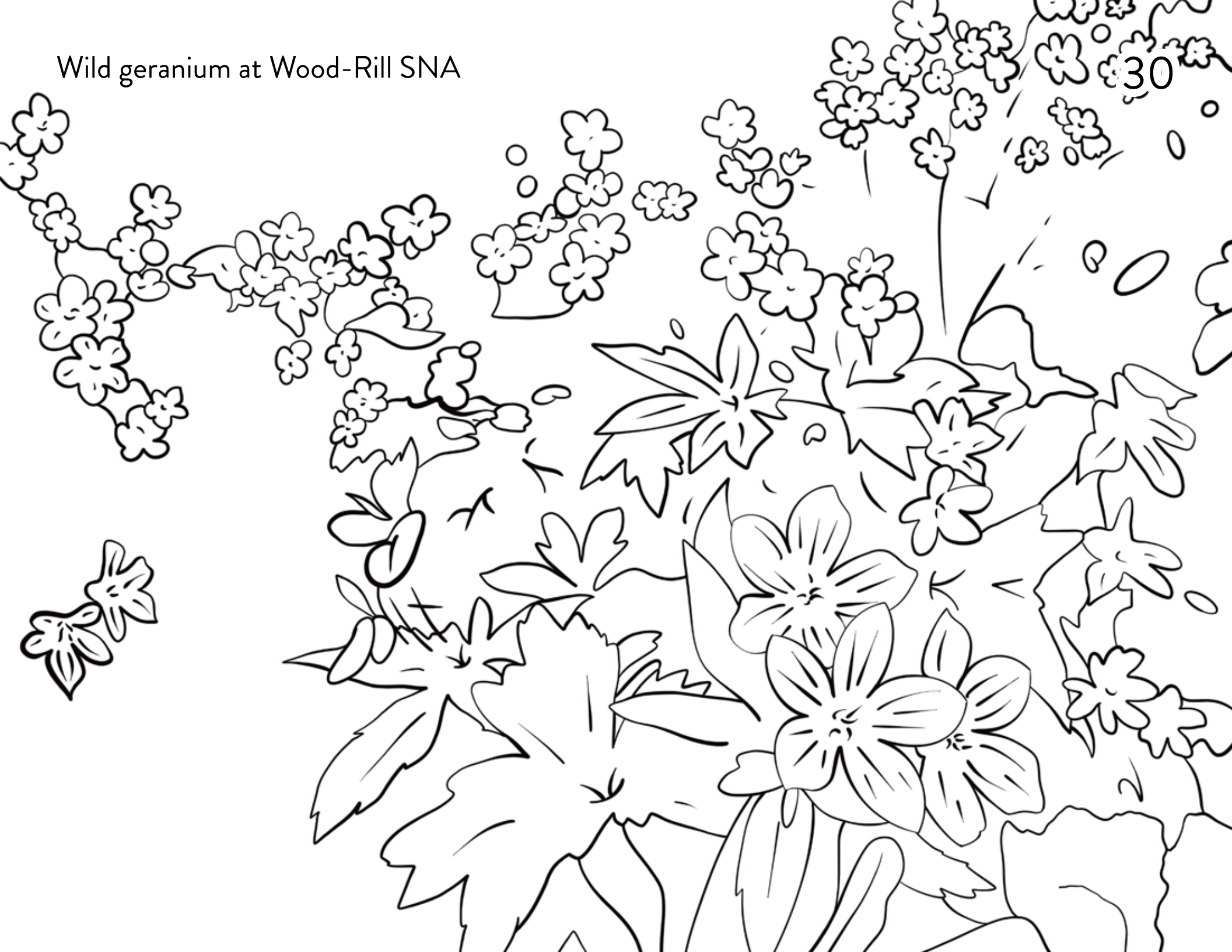






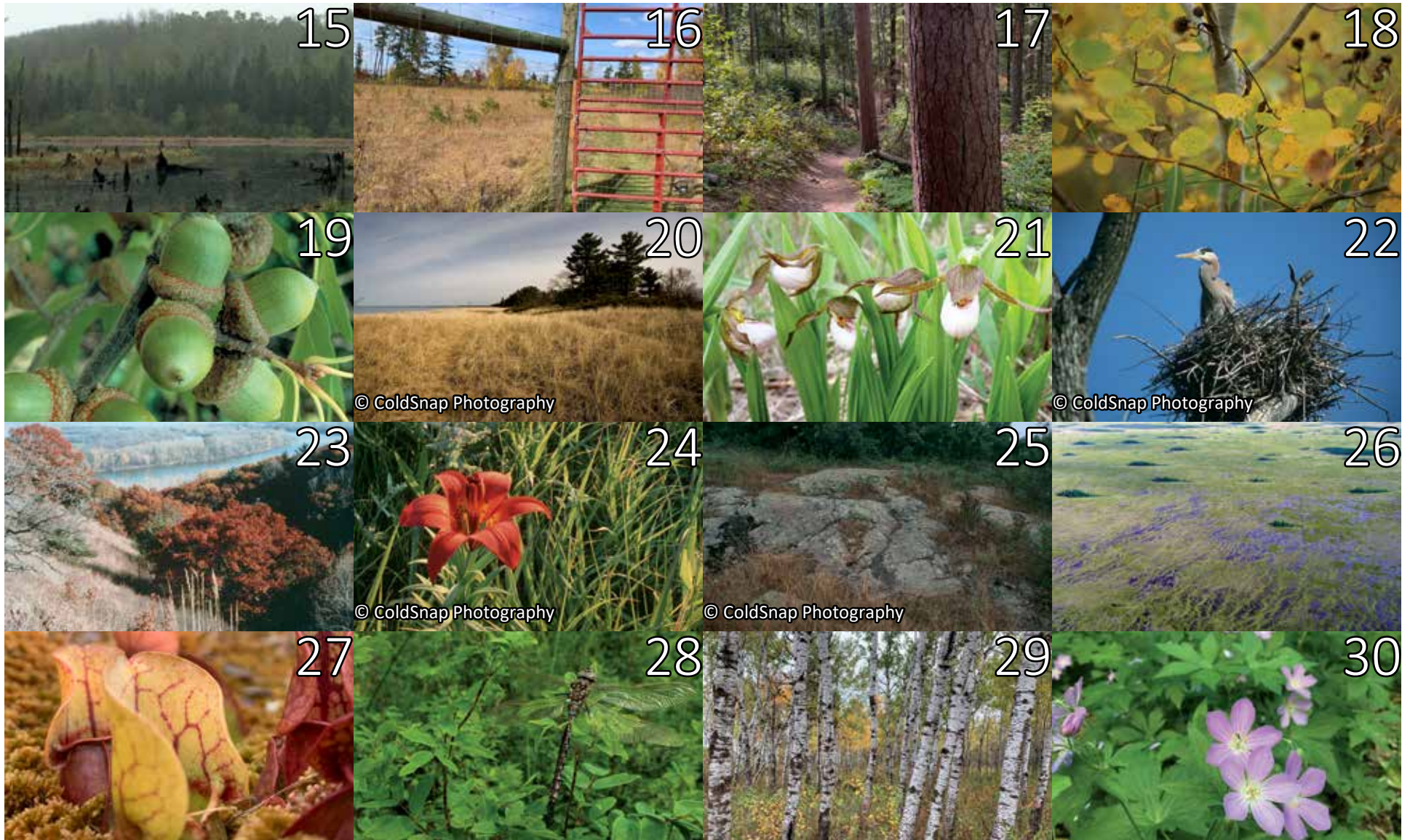


Wild geranium at Wood-Rill SNA
