Establishing an Earthcache on a Minnesota Scientific and Natural Area (SNA)

Introduction

An Earthcache is a GPS-based recreational activity focusing on the educational and interpretive features of a cache site. Earthcaches must provide an earth science lesson. Unlike a geocache, an earthcache does not place physical objects on a site. Following these instructions and submitting an application are necessary for a permit to be granted establishing an earthcache on any Minnesota Scientific and Natural Area. Geocaches are prohibited on all Natural Areas.

Permit Required

- 1. Persons responsible for an earthcache *must* have an approved permit. Each earthcache requires its own permit. Earthcaches may not be appropriate on some Natural Areas. SNA Staff reserve the right to deny a permit. Some permits may require additional approval on sites managed by other organizations.
- 2. Persons responsible for an earthcache will be contacted annually to:
 - a. insure that the earthcache is still active,
 - b. address any issues that may have arisen,
 - c. and renew the permit.
- 3. In addition to an earthcache permit, persons interested in conducting a short-term, sponsored event related to an earthcache may be required to obtain a Special Use Permit.

Selecting a Site

- 1. Minnesota SNA Staff (Regional Specialist) must be consulted to assist in selecting an appropriate site for an earthcache.
- 2. Earthcaches must not negatively impact natural and cultural resources other visitors or their safety.
- 3. Earthcaches will not be allowed on sites where they could interfere with management activities.

Important to Know

- 1. The Minnesota SNA Program retains the right to close or temporarily suspend any earthcache.
- 2. Each earthcache must include the following links:

- 3. Each earthcache must have a statement on the purpose (customized for that earthcache) and a statement on methods for preventing the introduction of invasive species.
- 4. Persons responsible for a permitted earthcache must follow all Minnesota Scientific and Natural Area rules (see link above) and all Earthcache Guidelines at http://earthcache.org/guidelines.
- 5. Permitted earthcaches will be hosted at www.geocaching.com.

Application Instructions

- 7. Consult with Regional SNA Specialist or designee to select an appropriate site on an SNA for an earthcache.
- 2. Obtain GPS coordinates for the location(s) being proposed for review.
- 3. Mark location(s) on a map of the SNA and submit coordinates and map with application*.
- 4. Complete application and e-mail to mark.cleveland@state.mn.us. Review and approval or denial of permit application may take up to 30 days. Application may also be mailed to: Mark Cleveland, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, 500 Lafayette Road, St. Paul, MN 55155-4025. Review of mailed applications will take slightly longer to complete.
- 5. Applicant and www.geocaching.com will be notified of approved permit applications.

Reminder: earthcaches may only be established after approved permit has been received.
