

BIRD CHECKLIST

LAKE SHETEK STATE PARK



Birding at Lake Shetek State Park

The trail around Loon Island is a good place to view rose-breasted grosbeaks, woodpeckers, blue jays, nuthatches and chickadees.

The observation dock at Eastlick Marsh has a spotting scope and interpretive signs about the red-winged blackbirds, pelicans, mallards, Canada geese and other waterfowl that can be seen. It is also a good place to view prairie bird species like swallows, bluebirds, bobolinks, sparrows, pheasants and turkey vultures.

The Webster Island Trail, which overlooks Webster Slough, is a hotspot for waterfowl. This wetland area offers a quiet space for birds due to the lack of boat traffic.

Enter the date you saw the bird.

Bird Identification Tips

When you observe a bird, make note of at least three characteristics.

Location: Where did you see the bird? (water, forest, feeder, lower branch, tree trunk, etc.)

Body size and shape: Compare to a known bird. (smaller than a...bigger than a...plump like a...slender like a...) Look at tail, legs and bill. (long, short, thick, thin, curved, straight)

Colors and markings: Look on wings, tail, back, belly, rump and head. (stripe above eye, white spot on tail, etc.)

Sounds and movements: How do they act and sound? (travel alone or in groups, in-flight wing position - soaring, flapping, flap and glide, etc.)
