## Guide to the Nongame Mammals of South Central Minnesota

### Region 4 East

This preliminary guide has been prepared as a reference to the occurrence and distribution of nongame mammals of Region 4 East in south central Minnesota. Taxonomy is based on Jones, et al., (1975). Identification marks are described in Burt and Grossenheider (1964).

Game mammals have not been included in this survey.

Counties in this region are Waseca, Blue Earth, LeSueur, Nicollet, Sibley, Brown, and McLeod. Figure 1 is a map of Region 4 East.

A total of 27 nongame mammal species are found in Region 4 East. The pygmy shrew, least shrew, eastern mole, silver-haired bat, short-tailed weasel, least weasel, eastern chipmunk, northern flying squirrel, plains pocket mouse, and northern grasshopper mouse are hypothetical species needing documentation.

The house mouse and Norway rat are the only two exotic species.

#### Priority species

There are no species which are found only in Region 4 East. Priority species for which more data is needed are the Keen's little brown bat, Eastern pipistrelle, big brown bat, long-tailed weasel, spotted skunk, and southern flying squirrel.

#### Threatened and Endangered Species

There are no officially threatened or endangered nongame mammals in Region 4 East.

#### Data Collection

If you encounter any new county records, be sure to record the date, county, township, range, section number (or distance and direction from the nearest town) and habitat in which the animal was found. Note all identifying features which distinguish that species from similar ones. Photographs or plaster casts of tracks are important for large mammals like cougars. Skulls of small mammal specimens should be retained for documentation of new county records when studies result in the collection of specimens.
