

Adapting Tree Cookies & Tree ID Lessons for Students Who Are Sight-Impaired

Use a product such as Tacky Glue, WikiStix, or other product to create raised lines on surfaces of tree cookies or leaves.



Use Tacky Glue or other product to create raised lines over the annual rings on a tree cookie to allow children who are sight-impaired to read the rings. If the tree's rings are too close together, make up your own rings, emulating what nature would do: make some lines narrow, others wide. If the glue runs when wet, use a toothpick and run it between the lines to separate them before they harden.



Use WikiStix or other product to create raised lines over leaf veins so that children who are sight-impaired can identify leaves more easily. Laminate if desired.
