He was unfamiliar with the handgun he was shooting. 9. 9-02-09 Bear Nonfatal Yes Handgun 65 N Dropped firearm Summary: Victim/shooter was shot in the left elbow area when his unsnapped holster caught on the tree stand he was climbing up causing the revolver to fall out and hit the ladder and discharge. **10**. 9-29-09 Skunk Nonfatal Yes Shotgun 48 Y Careless handling of firearm Summary: Victim/shooter was walking after a skunk while holding the gun when it discharged striking himself in the right foot. **11**. 9-30-09 Grouse Nonfatal No Shotgun 50 Y 43 Y Victim out of sight of shooter Summary: Shooter and victim had been walking in the woods together 70 - 80 yards apart when shooter altered his course to avoid a deadfall. The bird dog with them jumped a bird and the shooter shot it hitting the victim with several bbs in the facial area. 29 Y 12. 10-03-09 Duck/Geese Nonfatal No Shotgun 55 N Victim moved into line of fire Summary: Victim and shooter were unknowingly hunting across a slough from each other. When shooter fired at some waterfowl on the pond, shotgun pellets ricocheted off the water with two pellets striking victim causing minor iniurv.

**13**. 10-03-09 Duck/Geese Nonfatal No Shotgun 39 N 13 Y Shooter stumbled and fell **Summary:** The shooter stepped in a hole and fell as he was walking behind the victim. The shooter's shotgun discharged and the bullet hit the victim in the left shoulder blade.

14. 10-08-09GrouseNonfatalYesHandgun60 YDischarge firearm in/on vehicleSummary:Victim/shooter shot himself in the upper right thigh as he was unloading his pistol while seated in his car<br/>with his legs outside the vehicle.Discharge firearm in/on vehicle

**15**. 10-08-09 Grouse Nonfatal No Shotgun 59 Y 23 Y Failure to check beyond target **Summary:** Victim sustained several pellet wounds when the shooter turned to shoot at a bird that was in the same direction of the victim.

**16**. 10-17-09 Pheasant Nonfatal No Shotgun 44 Y 37 Y Failure to check beyond target **Summary:** Victim was downrange from the shooter. Victim was hit with several bbs when shooter shot at a raccoon that his dog scared up.

Four people shot at the deer and one of the bullets struck the victim in the upper left leg. **18**. 11-07-09 Rifle 77 N Fatal Yes Careless handling of firearm Deer Summary: Victim/shooter was found laying on the ground. There was one spent casing on the ground near victim/shooter and one inside the gun. Rifle 34 Y **19.** 11-07-09 Deer Nonfatal Yes Firearm fell from insecure rest Summary: While victim/shooter was reaching for some beef jerky his gun fell off the stand and discharged hitting him in the hand. **20.** 11-07-09 Nonfatal Yes Shotgun 15 Y Faulty equipment Deer Summary: Victim/shooter pumped the action and pulled the trigger to shoot at a deer for a second time. The gun misfired so he pumped the action and pulled the trigger. The shotgun chamber and barrel exploded and the wood stock shattered. 28 Y **21.** 11-08-09 Rifle Deer Nonfatal No 27 Y Discharge firearm in/on vehicle **Summary:** Victim was shot in the upper right thigh as shooter pulled the bolt back to check if his gun was unloaded. Shooter was unsure how the gun went off. **22.** 11-08-09 Deer Nonfatal Yes Handgun 18 N Careless handling of firearm Summary: Victim/shooter drew his hand gun and was walking with it. Somehow he shot himself in the right calf muscle. **23.** 11-08-09 Deer Nonfatal Yes Handgun 44 Y Trigger caught on object Summary: Victim/shooter was holstering his handgun after killing a deer when the gun fired shooting himself in the hip. **24.** 11-13-09 Nonfatal No Rifle 12 N Discharge firearm in/on vehicle Deer 47 N Summary: After hunting, the shooter placed his gun in the back of a truck on top of victim's pack sack. Shortly after the victim received a gun shot in the left elbow. Shooter claims the safety was on. **25.** 12-06-09 Nonfatal Muzzleloader 38 N Unloading firearm Deer Yes Summary: Victim/shooter was unloading his firearm and had the barrel on his left foot. He believes he accidently pulled the trigger while trying to take the primer off causing a bullet to strike the small toe of his left foot.






