## Conservation Partners Legacy Grant Program Best Practices for Applicants

- Highlight the goal(s) of your project clearly and concisely.
  - Your goals should be found easily in your application, and not buried in the middle of text.
- If you plan to seed an area or plant an area directly with seeds and shrubs, provide a list of seeds and plant species to be used.
  - Seed mixes and plant lists can be uploaded as an additional attachment.
  - For prairie and savanna projects, seed mixes are recommended over forb and grass plugs.

- Highlight the direct benefits that your project will provide to specific species of wildlife.

- If your project has a high cost per acre, clearly justify why that is in your application.
- Make your budget as detailed as possible, highlighting specifically how funds will be used in each category.
- Follow the Minnesota DNR's guidance for invasive species removal methodology.
