



2020 - 2021 Archery in the Schools Program Equipment Process

Instructions and Recommendations

TIMELINE

July 1, 2020	Program equipment application period open, applications will be reviewed as they are received. All applicants will receive notification if successful or not.
Upon approval	Sign and return contracts, submit appropriate matching funds.
April 1, 2021	All applications due. No applications will be accepted after this date.
May 1, 2021	All remaining contracts and checks due.
September 2020 - March 2021	Due to the corona virus all training is currently on hold

INSTRUCTIONS: Fill out and submit the one-page Program Equipment application by April 1, 2021. You may include a cover letter, support letters from partnering groups, retailers and clubs, and pledge letters from potential sponsors.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Obtain the appropriate required financial match.
- Basic NASP equipment package \$1,800.00 match, 3-D target set \$1,250.00 match, or both \$3,050.00 match.
- Lead instructor(s) must attend Basic Archery Instructor (BAI) training. Registration costs for training of up to two instructors is only included in the Basic NASP equipment package.

EQUIPMENT AGREEMENT CONTACT: This is the person who will fill out the application and be the primary point of contact. They will be responsible for the equipment when it is received, coordinate training for their site and partner groups, and other related program equipment responsibilities. Communication with program contact will be by email whenever possible.

PRINCIPLE LOCATION: The educational facility where the program contact is located and the equipment will be shipped. The equipment is shipped directly from the manufacturers and may not all arrive at the same time.

PARTNERING PROGRAMS: Proposals that share their equipment with multiple partnering programs will receive a higher priority for funding.

PARTNERING WITH RETAILER/CLUB: Archery is a lifetime sport and providing information on where participants can go to expand their archery opportunities is a priority. The archery industry is strongly encouraging retailers and clubs to offer support to their local school programs at greatly reduced fees. We encourage you to make contact with a local shop or club to support your team and establish a place where students and their families can go to take their archery skills to a higher level.

EXISTING ARCHERY PROGRAMS: We encourage applications that will replace existing archery equipment that consists of recurve and standard compound bows, with the new universal draw compound bows. Non-aluminum arrows should also be replaced.

PROGRAM PRIORITY CRITERIA

1. Equal distribution of archery equipment between metro and non-metro schools
2. Programs that maximize number of participants
3. Innovative proposals
4. Financial match commitment
5. Programs that cater to all ages
6. Programs that promote and support bow hunting

BASIC NASP EQUIPMENT DESCRIPTION - \$1,800.00 match required

- 10 right handed universal draw length bows, 10-20 pound draw weights
- 2 left handed universal draw length bows, 10-20 pound draw weights
- 10 dozen aluminum 1820 arrows, 31" long
- 5 targets (36'x36'x11'/40#)
- 1 backstop net (Kevlar, 8.5'x30')
- 1 repair kit
- Basic Archery Instructor (BAI) training for up to two staff members

Be sure to have a plan for storage of equipment before applying. The equipment does take up a significant amount of room. The targets, when stacked are 3'x3'x5'. The bows, arrows and backstop net, when stored in a storage box (blueprints available) are approximately 4'x 2.3/4'x 2'. The required BAI Certification is a full day of training.

- (1) 3-D Coyote Target
- (1) 3-D Bear Target
- (1) 3-D Pronghorn Target
- (1) 3-D Whitetail Deer Target
- (1) 3-D Big Horn Sheep Target
- (6) 3-D Target Stands
- The 3-D Kit **does not come with BAI Training**

DEADLINE On or before April 1, 2021. Equipment agreements will be awarded upon approval in order of submission.
