# 2018 - 2019 Archery Equipment Grant

Instructions and Recommendations

#### TIMELINE:

July 1, 2018	Grant application period starts and we will review as they are received. All applicants will receive notification if successful or not.		
Ongoing	Sign and return, contracts, submit matching funds (\$1,250.00).		
May 1, 2019	All remaining contracts and checks due.		
June 29, 2019	Grant cycle ends.		
September 2018 - March 2019	Training sessions held.		

**GRANT INSTRUCTIONS**: Fill out and submit the one page application by April 1, 2019 for consideration (*see note above relating to closing dates*). You may include a cover letter, letters of support from partnering groups, letters of support from partnering retailers and clubs, and pledge letters from potential sponsors.

**GRANT CONTACT**: Generally, this is the Director who will take care of filling out the application, be responsible for the equipment when it is received; coordinate training for their site and partnering groups, etc. They will be the primary point of contact. We try to communicate by e-mail whenever possible.

**PRINCIPLE LOCATION**: The ELC. REC. DEPT the grant contact is located. This is also the location that we will have the equipment shipped. The equipment is shipped directly from manufacturers and does not all arrive at the same time.

**PARTNERING PROGRAMS**: The grant selection committee recommends that multiple groups share equipment so that more participants have access to this valuable equipment. Proposals with multiple PROGRAMS partnering will receive a higher priority for funds.

**PARTNERING WITH RETAILER/CLUB:** Archery is a lifetime sport, and directing participants to a place where they can expand their archery opportunities beyond your program is a priority. The archery industry is strongly encouraging retailers and clubs to offer support to their local school program for greatly reduced fees. After all, you are helping generate customers for them. We strongly suggest you make contact with a local shop or club to help you with maintenance, and have referrals available to send students and their families there to get involved with archery at a higher level.

**EXISTING ARCHERY PROGRAMS:** We suggest that recurve and standard compound bows be replaced in favor of universal draw compound bows, and non-aluminum arrows should be replaced.

## **CRITERIA THE GRANT COMMITTEE WILL CONSIDER**

- 1. Metro/Rural Ratio of 50:50 is a goal
- 2. Reaching the maximum number of participants is valued
- 3. Innovative proposals are encouraged
- 4. Getting financial requirement in order early
- 5. Programs that cater to all ages
- 6. Programs that promote and support bow hunting
