

Incident Qualification System (IQS)

The Minnesota Incident Qualification System (IQS) is a web-based software computer program to document qualifications, training, physical fitness levels, and experience of wildland firefighters.

Some of the key points about Minnesota IQS:

- IQS allows users to track incident qualifications, experience, task books, and fitness levels for individuals across different organizational levels within their agencies.
- Produce Incident Qualification cards (Red Cards) recognized by the interagency fire community.
- Upload qualifications into the Interagency Resource Ordering Capability (IROC).
- IROC is the national interagency application for resource ordering for all hazard incidents.
 IROC is web-based and provides supports for deployment within the interagency fire community.
- The State of Minnesota, Division of Forestry Fire Training Program hosts the IQS software (IQS Web) and data server providing the gateway between IQS Web and IROC. MNDNR incurs **all** costs associated with hosting the software and managing the IQS Web servers within Minnesota. IQS Web is available for local and state government firefighters.
