Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the EAW prepared for the above project. It has been reviewed pursuant to the responsibilities given the Minnesota Historical Society by the Minnesota Historic Sites Act and the Minnesota Field Archaeology Act.

As you know, the Carlos Avery Game Farm is listed in the National Register of Historic Places, and the brooder houses are contributing resources which add to the property's historic associations and functions. As we noted in an earlier review of the project, the proposed demolition would have an adverse effect on the historic values of the site.

We have reviewed the EAW submitted by DNR. Thank you for the opportunity to review and comment on the Environmental Assessment Worksheet (EAW) for the Carlos Avery Brooder Shed project (Project) located in Anoka County, Minnesota. The Project consists of the restoration of one historic brooder shed and demolition of four brooder sheds. Regarding matters for which the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) has regulatory responsibility and other interests, MPCA staff has the following comments for your consideration.

#### Solid Wastes, Hazardous Wastes, Storage Tanks (Item 20)

Please note that because the brooder sheds were painted with lead based paint, the soil in the area beneath or around the sheds may be impacted with elevated concentrations of lead due to flaking paint or past scraping or pressure washing of the sheds. The MPCA recommends that the Project proposer obtain an environmental consultant and work with the MPCA Voluntary Investigation and Cleanup (VIC) Program to identify the presence of contamination in the former location of the sheds and prepare a plan for any remediation or mitigation that may be necessary.
