The Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) has reviewed the above-referenced Environmental Assessment Worksheet (EAW) and would like to offer the following comments:

- 1. MnDOT has a State Highway (MN) 210 project that will reconstruct 11 miles of road surface, replace/repair pipes and improve access on MN 210 from the end of the four-lane in Brainerd to Ironton in 2019.
 - a. An element of this project includes changing the existing turn-lane configuration at Crow Wing County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 59 from a left-turn bypass lane to a left-turn lane. The Rural Intersection Conflict Warning System (RICWS), which advises motorists when traffic is approaching the intersection, is planned to remain deployed at this location.
 - b. Additional information on this project can be found on MnDOT's project website: http://www.dot.state.mn.us/d3/projects/2019/h210/.
- 2. The EAW identifies an estimated Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) of 5,100 near Crosby and 5,600 near Ironton. MnDOT records also show the AADT of MN 210 near Riverton and the Crow Wing CSAH 59 intersection is 9,700 as recorded in 2017. Higher traffic counts near CSAH 59 are related to the estimated 4,250 AADT of Crow Wing CSAH 12 that connects to Deerwood. MnDOT's interactive traffic data application can be accessed here: http://www.dot.state.mn.us/traffic/data/tma.html.
- 3. There is a history of crashes at the MN 210/CSAH 59 intersection due to limited sight distance of the curve and high embankment. We have concerns with increased traffic at the MN 210/CSAH 59 intersection, particularly during special events, as it will increase the risk of crashes at the intersection.

- 4. The EAW acknowledges two upcoming State Highway projects in the vicinity, including:
 - a. MN 6 pedestrian tunnel to connect the paved Cuyuna Lakes State Trail between Portsmouth Mine Lake and Croft Mine Historic Park in Crosby in partnership with the City of Crosby and the MN DNR. Construction is currently planned between July August 2019. Additional information on this project can be found on MnDOT's project website: http://www.dot.state.mn.us/d3/crosby-ironton/trail/.
 - b. MN 210 in Crosby Ironton that primarily includes reconstruction from 2nd Street SW to east of 3rd Avenue NE in Crosby and resurfacing from 2nd Street SW in Crosby to west of 6th Avenue SW in Ironton. Construction is currently planned in 2021. Additional information on this project can be found on MnDOT's project website: http://www.dot.state.mn.us/d3/crosby-ironton/index.html.
- 5. For informational purposes, MnDOT accepted project recommendations for Corridors of Commerce program funding prioritization in 2018. Statewide, 173 eligible projects were recommended, evaluated and scored. Among these projects was a two-lane to four-lane conversion project on MN 210 from Pillager to Ironton. This project was not selected during the 2018 Corridors of Commerce scoring process and there is not a schedule or funding dedicated for an expansion project.
- 6. There shall be no net increase in storm water runoff to the MnDOT right of way from said property. Computations of all storm water directed toward the right of way shall be provided to MnDOT. Contact Rich Munsch, District 3 Permits Supervisor, at 218/828-5778 for additional information.
- 7. Since the property abuts MnDOT right of way, a permit is required to perform any work in the right of way. Contact the above-mentioned District 3 Permits Supervisor for additional information.

Hello,

My name is Gail Haglund and I am a hydrologist in the Source Water Protection (SWP) Program at the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH). George Minerich (SWP planner) and I assist the city of Riverton with implementing measures in their wellhead protection plan. The city has specific measures regarding the need to identify and assess potential impacts to the aquifer serving their wells from proposed land-use changes within their Drinking Water Supply Management Area (DWSMA). In light of these measures, I have reviewed the EAW and have the following comments/corrections:

1. Figure 5 shows the wellhead protection boundaries that transect the Sagamore Unit. As part of this assessment, please also note the location of the city of Riverton's emergency response area (ERA) and DWSMA boundaries. These are important protection areas for the city's drinking water supply. The ERA is equivalent to a one-year travel time estimate, while the DWSMA represents the entire area to be managed by the city. These areas are shown on the attached map called: Riverton Drinking Water Protection Areas. Note that a majority of the proposed trailhead and event space is within the city of Riverton's DWSMA.

The results of microbiological sampling conducted since the establishment of the city's DWSMA has confirmed the vulnerable nature of the city's wells. The central portion of the proposed event space abuts the south side of the ERA boundary. It is our understanding that there will be a parking area(s) within the event space for 80 vehicles, with additional space to accommodate another 350 vehicles during special events. Because of the vulnerable nature of the city's wells and the potential for drinking water contaminants in stormwater runoff from the parking areas, we recommend locating stormwater treatment areas some distance away from the ERA and even beyond the portion of the WHPA that is within the proposed trailhead and event space, if possible (page 23).

- 2. If a new well is constructed as part of this project, please note that a well construction notification (similar to a permit) along with the appropriate fee must be submitted to the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH), and not to Crow Wing County as indicated on Table 6, page 12. Some counties in Minnesota have assumed responsibility for regulating well construction through delegation agreements with the MDH, however, Crow Wing county is not currently a delegated program. In addition, the well must be constructed by a licensed water well contractor.
- 3. If a new well is constructed to serve the public at the Sagamore Unit area, please be aware that it will be classed as a noncommunity public water supply well. As such, the well and public water system will be under the regulatory jurisdiction of the MDH, which will include sanitary inspection and monitoring requirements.




