Subject: Fourth Extension on Determination of the Need for an EIS Due to Insufficient information (Minn. R. 4410.1700 Subp 2a) for Lock and Dam Pool 2 Embankment Protective Island Environmental Assessment Worksheet

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) prepared and issued an Environmental Assessment Worksheet (EAW) for the proposed protective island to be constructed by the US Army Corps of Engineers in front of the Lock And Dam Pool 2 Embankment on the Mississippi River in Dakota County, Minnesota. The review and comment period on the EAW started on October 12, 2020 and ended November 12, 2020.

During the comment period, a substantive comment was received regarding the potential presence and appropriate habitat and breeding areas for Blanchard's Cricket Frogs (*Acris blanchardi*), within the project area. The DNR has been investigating this issue and has been in dialogue with the project proposer on the most appropriate approach to minimize potential harm to this species, but no mutually acceptable approach has been determined at this time. This issue must be resolved before the DNR can finalize the Record of Decision that will support DNR's determination on whether the proposed project has the potential for significant environmental effects and requires an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

Therefore, pursuant to Minnesota Rules 4410.1700 Subpart 2a, the DNR is postponing the decision on the need for an EIS until July 16, 2021, to add this missing information to our Record. This time frame was agreed to by both the DNR and the project proposer to accommodate state and federal holidays and the availability of technical staff whose expertise is specific to this issue. A memo of agreement between the DNR and the Corps is attached.
