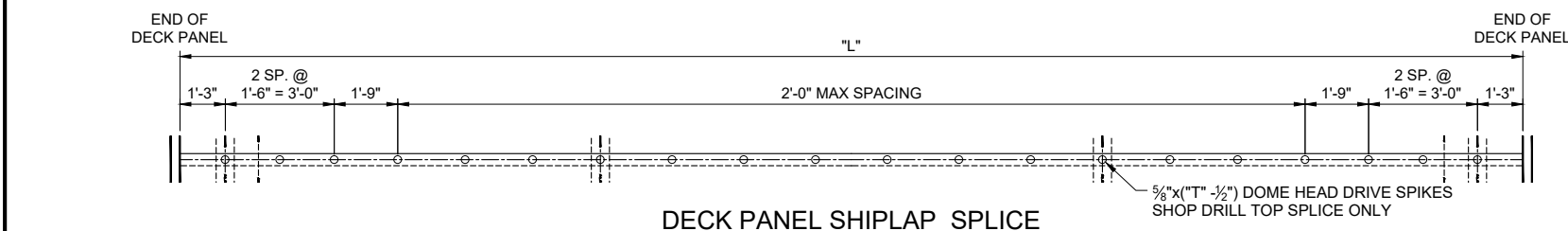
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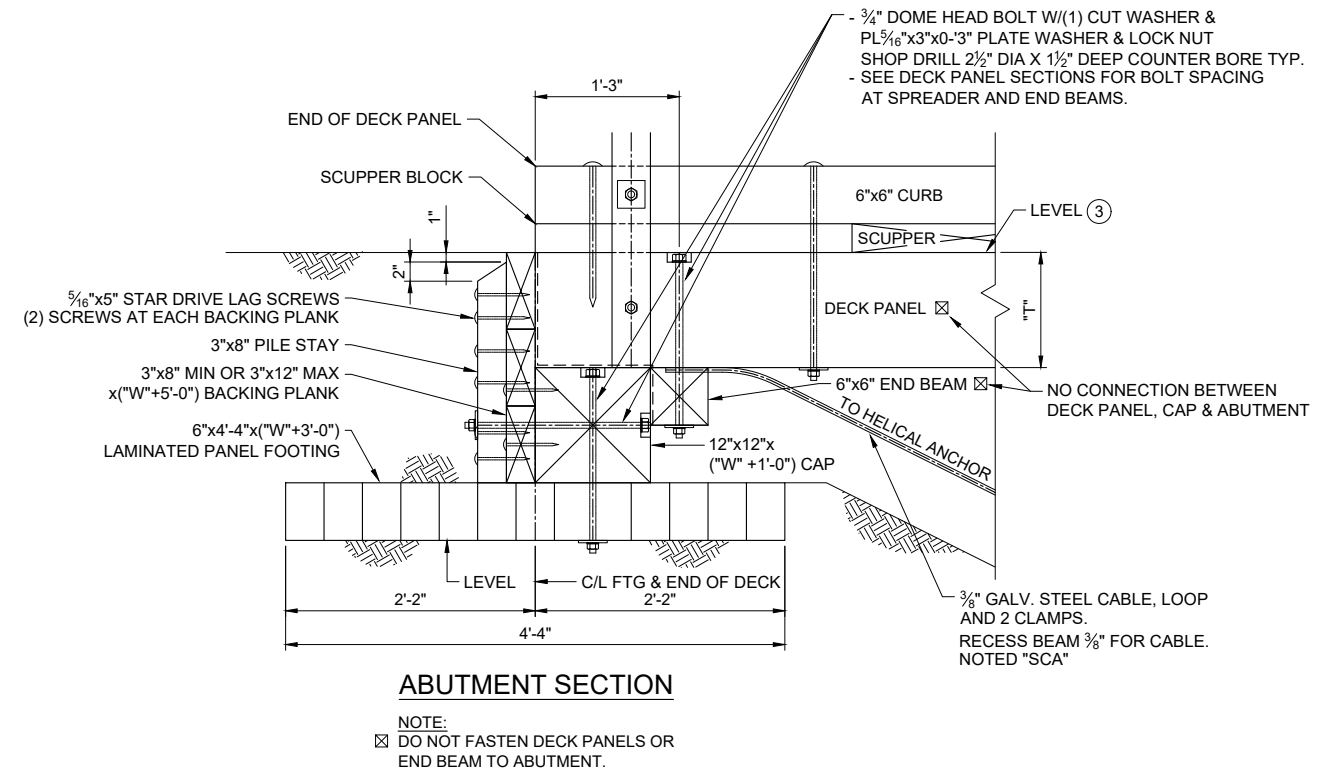
GENERAL PLAN

As requested, the [Minnesota Natural Heritage Information System](#) has been reviewed to determine if the proposed project has the potential to impact any rare species or other significant natural features. Based on the project details provided with the request, the following rare features may be impacted by the proposed project:

Ecologically Significant Areas

For reference, a Conservation Planning Report, which includes a detailed list of ecologically significant areas in the proposed project area, has been created and uploaded to the project page (2025-00462-02-CPR).

- The Minnesota Biological Survey (MBS) has identified Sites of Biodiversity Significance within the vicinity of the proposed project. Sites of Biodiversity Significance (MBS Sites) have varying levels of native biodiversity and are ranked based on the relative significance of this biodiversity at a statewide level. Factors taken into account during the ranking process include the number of rare species documented within the site, the quality of the native plant communities in the site, the size of the site, and the context of the site within the landscape. **The DNR recommends avoidance of MBS Sites ranked *High* or *Outstanding*.**
- DNR Native Plant Communities (NPCs) have been documented within the vicinity of the proposed project. A native plant community is a group of native plants that interact with each other and with their environment in ways not greatly altered by modern human activity or by introduced organisms. Native plant communities are classified and described by considering vegetation, hydrology, landforms, soils, and natural disturbance regimes. DNR NPC types are given a Conservation Status Rank that reflects the relative rarity and endangerment of the community type in Minnesota. Conservation Status Ranks range from S1 (*critically imperiled*) to S5 (*secure, common, widespread, and abundant*); NPCs with a Conservation Status Rank of S1 through S3 are considered rare in Minnesota. **The DNR recommends avoidance of rare NPCs (ranked S1-S3).**

- Old-growth forests may be impacted by the proposed project. Old-growth forests are natural forests that have developed over a long period of time, generally at least 120 years, without experiencing severe, stand-replacing disturbances such as fires, windstorms, or logging. Old-growth forests are a unique, nearly vanished piece of Minnesota's history and ecology; less than 4% of Minnesota's old-growth forests remain. **The DNR recommends avoidance of old growth forests.** If avoidance is not feasible, please coordinate with your DNR Regional Ecologist to avoid or minimize disturbance.
- **Fish Lake Flowage** has been identified as a Lake of *Outstanding* Biological Significance. Lakes of Biological Significance were ranked as *Outstanding*, *High* or *Moderate* based on unique plant and animal presence. This particular lake was ranked based on its fish, bird, and plant presence.
- We encourage you to consider project alternatives that would avoid or minimize disturbance to these ecologically significant areas. Actions to minimize disturbance may include, but are not limited to, the following recommendations:
 - As much as possible, operate within already-disturbed areas.
 - Minimize width of trail.
 - Minimize project footprint within MBS Sites ranked *High* or *Outstanding* and rare NPCs.
 - Conduct surveys to better document resource impact and designate areas to avoid
 - Do not route trails through wet swales or depressions, or sensitive rock outcrop areas.
 - Bridge all stream and wetland crossings.
 - Retain a buffer between proposed activities and the MBS Sites or other sensitive areas.
 - Minimize vehicular disturbance in the area (allow only vehicles/equipment necessary for construction activities).
 - Do not park equipment or stockpile supplies in the area.
 - Do not place spoil within MBS Sites or other sensitive areas.
 - Use effective erosion prevention and sediment control measures.
 - Inspect and clean equipment prior to operating and follow recommendations to [prevent the spread of invasive species](#).
 - Trail maintenance plans should address erodible soils, especially in areas of steep topography.
 - Use signage to encourage visitors to stay on designated trails.
 - Revegetate disturbed soil with [native species suitable to the local habitat](#) as soon after construction as possible.
 - Use only weed-free mulches, topsoils, and seed mixes.
 - Reference the [Guidelines for Managing and Restoring Natural Plant Communities along Trails and Waterways](#) for additional information.
- MBS Sites of Biodiversity Significance and DNR Native Plant Communities can be viewed using the Explore page in [Minnesota Conservation Explorer](#) (MCE) or their GIS shapefiles can be downloaded from the [MN Geospatial Commons](#). Minnesota Rules, part 8420.0515, subpart 3 states that a wetland replacement plan for activities that modify a RNC must be denied if the local government unit determines the proposed activities will permanently adversely affect the RNC. State-listed Species

- Several state-listed plant species have been documented in the vicinity of the proposed project; these are listed in table below. Minnesota's Endangered Species Statute (Minnesota Statutes, section 84.0895) and associated Rules (Minnesota Rules, part 6212.1800 to 6212.2300 and 6134) prohibit the take of endangered or threatened plants or animals, including their parts or seeds, without a permit. **To demonstrate avoidance, a qualified surveyor will need to determine if suitable habitat exists within the activity impact area and, if so, conduct a survey prior to any project activities.** Although species of special concern are not regulated under Minnesota's Endangered Species Statute, I recommend including them as target species for the survey. Additionally, I recommend adding Great Lakes Jacob's-ladder ([Polemonium lacustre](#)), a state-listed endangered species, and Garber's sedge ([Carex garberi](#)), a state-listed threatened species, as target species for the survey as preliminary information indicates that suitable habitat may exist in the project area.

Surveys must be conducted by a qualified surveyor and follow the standards contained in the [Rare Species Survey Process](#) and [Rare Plant Guidance](#). Visit the [Natural Heritage Review](#) page for a list of certified surveyors and more information on this process. Please note that the survey needs to be conducted by an individual with demonstrated experience surveying *Botrychium*/*Sceptridium* species and lichens. Survey proposals should be submitted to Reports.NHIS@state.mn.us prior to initiating survey work. Project planning should take into account that any botanical survey needs to be conducted

during the appropriate time of the year, which may be limited. Please consult Review.NHIS@state.mn.us if you have any questions regarding this process.

- Blanding's turtles (*Emydoidea blandingii*) and wood turtles (*Glyptemys insculpta*), both state-listed threatened species, have been documented in the vicinity of the proposed project. Factors believed to contribute to the decline of these species include collisions with vehicles, fragmentation, habitat destruction, and collection for pet trade. Any added mortality can be detrimental to populations, as these turtles have a low reproduction rate that depends upon a high survival rate to maintain population levels.
 - Blanding's turtles use upland areas up to and over a mile distant from wetlands, waterbodies, and watercourses. Uplands are used for nesting, basking, periods of dormancy, and traveling between wetlands.
 - Wood turtles are found in fast-moving streams with sand or gravel substrates and with adjacent forests. They also use alder swamps, forest, or grassland habitat typically within a quarter-mile of streams for basking and foraging. Sandy, sparsely vegetated areas that are not prone to flooding and have ample exposure to direct sunlight provide important nesting sites.

The proposed project has the potential to impact these rare turtles through direct fatalities and habitat disturbance/destruction. Minnesota's Endangered Species Statute (Minnesota Statutes, section 84.0895) and associated Rules (Minnesota Rules, part 6212.1800 to 6212.2300 and 6134) prohibit the take of threatened or endangered species without a permit. **As such, please contact Review.NHIS@state.mn.us to confirm that the following measures will be implemented:**

- Avoid wetland and aquatic impacts during overwintering season, between September 15 and April 15, if the area is suitable for overwintering.
 - Wetlands and aquatic habitats that freeze solid to the bed (no liquid water) are not suitable overwintering habitat. However, turtles will overwinter in wetlands and aquatic habitat where ice has closed over the water's surface.
- Limit erosion and sediment control to [wildlife friendly erosion control](#).
- Check bare ground within construction areas for turtles before the use of heavy equipment or any ground disturbance.
- The [Blanding's turtle flyer](#) must be given to all contractors working in the area.
- Report any sightings using the [DNR Plant and Animal Observation Form](#).
 - Immediately notify Bridget Henning-Randa (Bridget.Henning-Randa@state.mn.us or 651-259-5073) for sightings of an injured, dead, or nesting turtle.
- If turtles are in imminent danger, move them by hand out of harm's way; otherwise, they are to be left undisturbed. Directions on how to move turtles safely can be found at [Helping Turtles Across the Road](#).

If the above measures are not feasible, please contact Review.NHIS@state.mn.us as a project-specific avoidance plan will likely be needed to demonstrate avoidance.

Additional turtle avoidance measures may include, but are not limited to, the following recommendations:

- As illegal collection is a concern with these species, please do not post any signs that would bring attention to the presence of these turtles.
 - Recommendations from List 1 and List 2 of the [Blanding's turtle fact sheet](#).
 - Avoid hydro-mulch products that contain any materials with synthetic (plastic) fiber additives, as the fibers can re-suspend and flow into waterbodies.
 - Avoid disturbance to floodplain habitats as much as feasible, especially April through late September.
 - Do not leave sand piles along river, as they may be used for nesting.
 - Terrain should be left with as much natural contour as possible. Graded areas should be re-vegetated with native grasses and forbs. Use of fertilizers and pesticides should be avoided.
 - Avoid or minimize using instream erosion and sediment control practices as turtles are mobile in streams and may get trapped.
 - Avoid hydro-mulch products that contain any materials with synthetic (plastic) fiber additives, as the fibers can re-suspend and flow into waterbodies.
- Four-toed salamanders ([Hemidactylium scutatum](#)), a state-listed species of special concern, have been documented in the vicinity of the proposed project. Four-toed salamanders are typically found in small, isolated colonies. Adults generally inhabit mature hardwood forests associated with wetland depressions or small streams. They find shelter in the forest floor under leaf litter, woody debris, rocks, and moss. Females lay eggs in sphagnum moss hummocks, in shallow wetlands, or stream-side pools where hatchlings move into the water after emerging from the egg. The greatest threat to four-toed salamanders is loss and degradation of upland forest habitat and the loss of wetlands, which are used as nesting sites. **Please see the "[Forest Management Guidelines for the Protection of Four-toed and Spotted Salamander Populations](#)" for recommendations to minimize adverse impacts to these rare species.** Although these guidelines were written for DNR Forestry staff, we strongly encourage you to consider adopting relevant measures for your project. Please use your NHIS License Agreement to identify avoidance areas for four-toed salamanders.
 - Big brown bats ([Eptesicus fuscus](#)), a state-listed species of special concern, have been documented in the vicinity of the proposed project. During the active season (approximately April-November) bats roost underneath bark, in cavities, or in crevices of both live and dead trees. Tree removal can negatively impact bats by destroying roosting habitat, especially during the pup rearing season when females are forming maternity roosting colonies and the pups cannot yet fly. To minimize these impacts, **the DNR recommends that tree removal be avoided from June 1 through August 15.**
 - American goshawk ([Astur atricapillus](#)), a state-listed bird species of special concern, has been documented in the vicinity of the proposed project. This species is found in large, older upland forests systems. They are impacted by fragmentation, loss of forest diversity, and decrease in mature trees. **Trees should be inspected for nests prior to being cut down.** Please contact the Regional Nongame Specialist, Gaea Crozier (gaea.e.crozier@state.mn.us or 218-328-8811), if any nests are discovered.

- Trumpeter swans ([Cygnus buccinator](#)), a state-listed species of special concern, have been documented nesting in the vicinity of the proposed project. During the breeding season, trumpeter swans select small ponds and lakes with extensive beds of cattails, bulrush, sedges, and/or horsetail. Ideal habitat includes about 100 m of open water for take-off, stable levels of unpolluted water, emergent vegetation, low levels of human disturbance, and the presence of muskrat (*Ondatra zibethicus*) houses and American beaver (*Castor canadensis*) lodges for use as nesting platforms. If any of the wetlands on site provide suitable habitat, swans may choose to nest in these wetlands. **The DNR recommends avoiding construction activities during the nesting season, late April through early June, near suitable nesting habitat.**
- Creek heelsplitter ([Lasmigona compressa](#)) and black sandshell ([Ligumia recta](#)), both state-listed mussel species of special concern, have been documented in the several rivers in the vicinity of the proposed project. No state-listed mussels have been observed in the waterbodies identified for the six new water crossings, but these waterbodies connect to rivers where state-listed mussels are present. Mussels are particularly vulnerable to deterioration in water quality, especially increased siltation. Therefore, **it is important that effective erosion prevention and sediment control practices are maintained throughout the duration of the project to prevent adverse debris and material from impacting downstream populations.**

This species is found in large tracts of boreal and mixed conifer-hardwood forest where they are highly dependent on snowshoe hare for prey. Calcareous Fens

A calcareous fen is a rare and distinctive peat-accumulating wetland that is legally protected in Minnesota under the Wetland Conservation Act (*Minnesota Statutes, section 103G.223*). For Federal projects with a "Not Likely to Adversely Affect" (NLAA) determination, our concurrence becomes valid if you do not hear otherwise from us after a 30-day review period, as indicated in your letter.

If your d-key output letter indicates additional coordination with the Minnesota-Wisconsin Ecological Services Field Office is necessary (i.e., you get a "May Affect" determination), you will be provided additional guidance on contacting the Service to continue ESA coordination outside of the key; ESA compliance cannot be concluded using the key for "May Affect" determinations unless otherwise indicated in your output letter.

Note: Once you obtain your official species list, you are not required to continue in IPaC with d-keys, although in most cases these tools should expedite your review. If you choose to make an effects determination on your own, you may do so. Northern Long-Eared Bats

Northern long-eared bats occur throughout Minnesota and Wisconsin and the information below may help in determining if your project may affect these species.

Suitable summer habitat for northern long-eared bats consists of a wide variety of forested/wooded habitats where they roost, forage, and travel and may also include some adjacent and interspersed non-forested habitats such as emergent wetlands and adjacent edges of agricultural fields, old fields and pastures. This includes forests and woodlots containing potential roosts (i.e., live trees and/or snags ≥ 3 inches dbh for northern long-eared bat that have exfoliating bark, cracks, crevices, and/or hollows), as well as linear features such as fencerows, riparian forests, and other wooded corridors. These wooded areas may be dense or loose aggregates of trees with variable amounts of canopy closure. Individual trees may be considered suitable habitat when they exhibit the characteristics of a potential roost tree and are located within 1,000 feet (305 meters) of forested/wooded habitat. Northern long-eared bats have also been observed roosting in human-made structures, such as buildings, barns, bridges, and bat houses; therefore, these structures should also be considered potential summer habitat and evaluated for use by bats. If your project will impact caves or mines or will involve clearing forest or woodland habitat containing suitable roosting habitat, northern long-eared bats could be affected. For bat activity dates, please review Appendix L in the [Range-wide Indiana Bat and Northern Long-Eared Bat Survey Guidelines](#).

Examples of unsuitable habitat include:

- Individual trees that are greater than 1,000 feet from forested or wooded areas,
- Trees found in highly developed urban areas (e.g., street trees, downtown areas),
- A pure stand of less than 3-inch dbh trees that are not mixed with larger trees, and
- A monoculture stand of shrubby vegetation with no potential roost trees.

If IPaC returns a result that northern long-eared bats are potentially present in the action area of the proposed project, project proponents can conclude the proposed activities **may affect** this species **IF** one or more of the following activities are proposed:

- Clearing or disturbing suitable roosting habitat, as defined above, at any time of year,
- Any activity in or near the entrance to a cave or mine,
- Mining, deep excavation, or underground work within 0.25 miles of a cave or mine,
- Construction of one or more wind turbines, or
- Demolition or reconstruction of human-made structures that are known to be used by bats based on observations of roosting bats, bats emerging at dusk, or guano deposits or stains.

If none of the above activities are proposed, project proponents can conclude the proposed activities will have **no effect** on the northern long-eared bat. Concurrence from the Service is not required for **No Effect** determinations. No further consultation or coordination is required. Attach this letter to the dated IPaC

species list report for your records.

If any of the above activities are proposed, and the northern long-eared bat appears on the user's species list, the federal project user will be directed to either the northern long-eared bat and tricolored bat range-wide D-key or the Federal Highways Administration, Federal Railways Administration, and Federal Transit Administration Indiana bat/Northern long-eared bat D-key, depending on the type of project and federal agency involvement. Similar to the Minnesota-Wisconsin D-key, these d-keys help to determine if prohibited take might occur and, if not, will generate an automated verification letter. Additional information about available tools can be found on the Service's [northern long-eared bat website](#).

Whooping Crane

Whooping crane is designated as a non-essential experimental population in Wisconsin and consultation under Section 7(a)(2) of the Endangered Species Act is only required if project activities will occur within a National Wildlife Refuge or National Park. If project activities are proposed on lands outside of a National Wildlife Refuge or National Park, then you are not required to consult. For additional information on this designation and consultation requirements, please review "[Establishment of a Nonessential Experimental Population of Whooping Cranes in the Eastern United States](#)."

Other Trust Resources and Activities

Bald and Golden Eagles - Although the bald eagle has been removed from the endangered species list, this species and the golden eagle are protected by the Bald and Golden Eagle Act and the Migratory Bird Treaty Act. It is the responsibility of the project proponent to survey the area for any migratory bird nests. If there is an eagle nest on-site while work is on-going, eagles may be disturbed. We recommend avoiding and minimizing disturbance to eagles whenever practicable. If you cannot avoid eagle disturbance, you may seek a [permit](#). A [nest take permit](#) is always required for removal, relocation, or obstruction of an eagle nest. For communication and wind energy projects, please refer to additional guidelines below.

Migratory Birds - The Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA) prohibits the taking, killing, possession, transportation, and importation of migratory birds, their eggs, parts, and nests, except when specifically authorized by the Service. The Service has the responsibility under the MBTA to proactively prevent the mortality of migratory birds whenever possible and we encourage implementation of [recommendations that minimize potential impacts to migratory birds](#). Such measures include clearing forested habitat outside the nesting season (generally March 1 to August 31) or conducting nest surveys prior to clearing to avoid injury to eggs or nestlings.

Communication Towers - Construction of new communications towers (including radio, television, cellular, and microwave) creates a potentially significant impact on migratory birds, especially some 350 species of night-migrating birds. However, the Service has developed [voluntary guidelines for minimizing impacts](#).

Transmission Lines - Migratory birds, especially large species with long wingspans, heavy bodies, and poor maneuverability can also collide with power lines. In addition, mortality can occur when birds, particularly hawks, eagles, kites, falcons, and owls, attempt to perch on uninsulated or unguarded power poles. To minimize these risks, please refer to [guidelines](#) developed by the Avian Power Line Interaction Committee and the Service. Implementation of these measures is especially important along sections of lines adjacent to wetlands or other areas that support large numbers of raptors and migratory birds.

Wind Energy - To minimize impacts to migratory birds and bats, wind energy projects should follow the Service's [Wind Energy Guidelines](#). In addition, please refer to the Service's [Eagle Conservation Plan Guidance](#), which provides guidance for conserving bald and golden eagles in the course of siting, constructing, and operating wind energy facilities.
