Forest Roads

- · Provide access for resource management activities and public use.
- · Are not considered "public highways," and the resource agencies are not "road authorities."
- · Are typically open to use by both highway-licensed vehicles (HLV) and off-highway vehicles (OHV).

System Forest Roads:

- · Graveled and maintained.
- Minimum width of 14 feet or 1 1/2 to two lanes wide, so highway-licensed vehicles can easily meet.
- Some on Wildlife Management Area lands are signed as closed to off-highway vehicles.
- Signed with system road name at major intersections.

Minimum Maintenance Forest Roads:

- · May be graveled or native soil surfaced.
- Width is narrow or one lane wide, making it difficult to meet vehicles.
- Caution is recommended when traveling, low-clearance highway vehicles may not be suited for use on these roads.
- · Will be signed "Road may be impassable. Travel at your own risk."

<u>ATV:</u> All-Terrain Vehicle, includes Class I and Class II <u>HLV:</u> Highway-Licensed Vehicle <u>OHM</u>: Off-Highway Motorcycle

ORV: Off-Road Vehicle

OHV: Off-Highway Vehicle, a generic term that includes ORV, ATV, and OHM, but not HLV.

Access Routes

- · Unassigned routes on State Forest lands classified as managed.
- Available for non-motorized and motorized use in an "as is" condition, with the user responsible for ensuring that there is no damage to the route.
- Illegal on these routes to operate a vehicle in a manner that causes erosion, rutting, or injuries, or that damages or destroys trees or growing crops (MN Rules 6100.1950 Subpart 7A).
- Width and route surface vary. All routes depicted may not be passable for all types of uses.
- Motor vehicle use under the hunting and trapping exceptions applies.
- Damaged routes are subject to proactive closure to motor vehicle use.
- Some routes may be isolated and require permission from private owners and/or Red Lake Band Tribal Council to travel to. These routes will be archived after this designation order is finalized.

Re-vegetated Paths

- Some routes may be non-discernable due to re-vegetation and motor vehicle use may violate MN Rules 6100.1950, Subpart 7A referenced above, these routes will be archived after this designation order is finalized.
- Motor vehicle use under the hunting and trapping exceptions applies.
- · Damaged routes are subject to proactive closure to motor vehicle use.

Proactive Closures

- · Routes where all public motor use is prohibited, including recreational OHV use and motor vehicle use under the hunting and trapping exceptions.
- Signs, gates, or barricades indicate this closure.

ATV & OHM Recreational Trail

- · Signed and maintained routes for ATV and OHM use that may use system and minimum maintenance forest roads for connections to local points of interest and facilities.
- · Additional parking/staging areas proposed

Non-Motorized Access Areas

- Areas within a managed forest where all public motor vehicle use is prohibited including recreational OHV use and motor vehicle use under the hunting/trapping exceptions.
- Signs or gates indicate this closure.

Walking Trails

- · Signed, maintained routes for walking and non-motorized use.
- · Includes routes currently signed and managed as walking trails.

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
