* St. Croix State Park is designated as a National Historic Landmark because of its development as a Recreation Demonstration Area (RDA). The RDA was developed as part of the New Deal programs created during the Great Depression. Many of the park's buildings, roads and trails were designed by the National Park Service and constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) and Works Progress Administration (WPA) between 1935 and 1942. The site was deeded to the state and became a state park in 1943.

Buildings, roads, and trails constructed during that time are considered contributing elements to the National Historic Landmark.
