1.2 **Proposed Expedited Permanent Game and Fish Rule: Northern Pike Regulation**

1.3 **6262.0200 FISHING REGULATIONS FOR INLAND WATERS.**

1.4 Subpart 1. **General inland fishing regulations.** Fish may be taken in inland waters
1.5 by angling during the time specified for each of the following species; however, certain
1.6 waters of the state are subject to experimental or special regulations, ~~special regulations,~~
1.7 or are closed for the taking and possession of possessing fish. When the closing date of a
1.8 season falls on a Saturday, the season extends through the following Sunday.

1.11 (1) In all waters lying east and north of U.S.
1.12 Highway 53 from Duluth to International
1.13 Falls and Pelican and Ash Lakes, St.
1.14 Louis County.

1.15 Saturday two weeks prior to the Saturday
1.16 of Memorial Day weekend to the last
1.17 Sunday in February.

1.18 (2) In all other waters.

1.19 From the Saturday two weeks prior to
1.20 the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend
1.21 to the Saturday of Memorial Day
1.22 weekend, angling for bass is limited to
1.23 catch and release only. Any bass must
1.24 be immediately returned to the water.

1.25 It is unlawful for anyone to have in
1.26 possession, regardless of where taken,
1.27 any bass while on or fishing in these
1.28 waters. The Saturday of Memorial Day
1.29 weekend to the last Sunday in February
1.30 is the harvest season.

2.1 From the second Monday in September
2.2 to the end of the season, angling for
2.3 smallmouth bass is limited to catch and
2.4 release only. Any smallmouth bass must
2.5 be immediately returned to the water
2.6 and it is unlawful for anyone to have in
2.7 possession, regardless of where taken,
2.8 any smallmouth bass while on or fishing
2.9 in these waters.

2.10 B. Brown trout.
2.11 Except as provided in part 6264.0400,
2.12 subparts 35, 36, 37, and 117, the
2.13 following restrictions apply.

2.14 (1) In all streams in Houston, Fillmore, 5 in aggregate with rainbow and brook
2.15 Mower, Dodge, Olmsted, Winona, trout and splake. No more than 1 may
2.16 Wabasha, and Goodhue Counties. be over 16 inches in length. Angling
2.17 January 1 to October 15. for trout is limited to catch and release
2.18 only from January 1 up to but not
2.19 including the Saturday nearest April
2.20 15 and from September 15 to October
2.21 15. During these time periods, all trout
2.22 must be immediately returned to the
2.23 water. It is unlawful for anyone to have
2.24 in possession, regardless of where taken,
2.25 any trout while on or fishing in these
2.26 waters. All legal methods of taking trout
2.27 are allowed.

2.28 (2) In all other streams, except those in part 5 in aggregate with rainbow and brook
2.29 6262.0300, subpart 6, item C, for St. trout and splake. No more than 1 may be
2.30 Louis, Lake, Carlton, and Cook Counties. over 16 inches in length.
2.31 Saturday nearest April 15 to September
2.32 30.

2.33 (3) In lakes only: 5 in aggregate with rainbow and brook
2.34 trout and splake. No more than 3 may be
2.35 over 16 inches in length.

2.36 (a) Statewide.
2.37 Saturday two weeks prior to Saturday of
2.38 Memorial Day weekend to October 31.

3.1 (b) All lakes entirely within the Boundary
3.2 Waters Canoe Area Wilderness.
3.3 January 1, except when January 1 falls
3.4 on a Sunday, Monday, or Tuesday,
3.5 then opening day is the preceding

3.19 Except as provided in part 6264.0400,
3.20 subparts 35, 36, 37, and 117, the

3.22 (1) In all streams in Houston, Fillmore,
3.23 Mower, Dodge, Olmsted, Winona,
3.24 Wabasha, and Goodhue Counties.
3.25 January 1 to October 15.

5 in aggregate with rainbow and brown trout and splake. No more than 1 may be over 16 inches in length. Angling for trout is limited to catch and release only from January 1 up to but not including the Saturday nearest April 15 and from September 15 to October 15. During these time periods, all trout must be immediately returned to the water. It is unlawful for anyone to have in possession, regardless of where taken, any trout while on or fishing in these waters. All legal methods of taking trout are allowed.

7.6 The northeastern management zone
7.7 includes all inland waters lying east
7.8 and north of U.S. Highway 53 from
7.9 International Falls to Duluth.

When taking northern pike by angling,
only 1 over 40 inches in length may be in
possession; all northern pike from 30 to
40 inches in length must be immediately
returned to the water.

7.11 When taking northern pike by dark house
7.12 spearing, only 1 over 26 inches in length
7.13 may be in possession.

7.14 (2) North-central management zone.

7.15 The north-central management zone
7.16 includes all inland waters lying west
7.17 and south of U.S. Highway 53 from
7.18 International Falls to Duluth and north
7.19 of a line described as follows: from
7.20 the South Dakota border, along State
7.21 Highway 7 to State Highway 22, thence
7.22 south on State Highway 22 to U.S.
7.23 Highway 212, thence east on U.S.
7.24 Highway 212 to State Highway 41,
7.25 thence south on State Highway 41 to
7.26 the near or north bank of the Minnesota
7.27 River, thence along the near banks of
7.28 the Minnesota and Mississippi Rivers to
7.29 the Wisconsin border. The north-central
7.30 management zone does not include
7.31 waters of the Minnesota or Mississippi
7.32 Rivers where those waters create the
7.33 southern boundary of the zone.

When taking northern pike by angling,
only 2 over 26 inches in length may be in
possession; all northern pike from 22 to
26 inches must be immediately returned
to the water.

When taking northern pike by dark house
spearing, either:

(a) only 2 over 26 inches in length and
none from 22 to 26 inches in length may
be in possession; or

(b) only 1 from 22 to 26 inches in length
and 1 over 26 inches in length may be
in possession.

 10.28 ~~one northern pike over 30 inches in length. The possession limit for northern pike is three.~~
