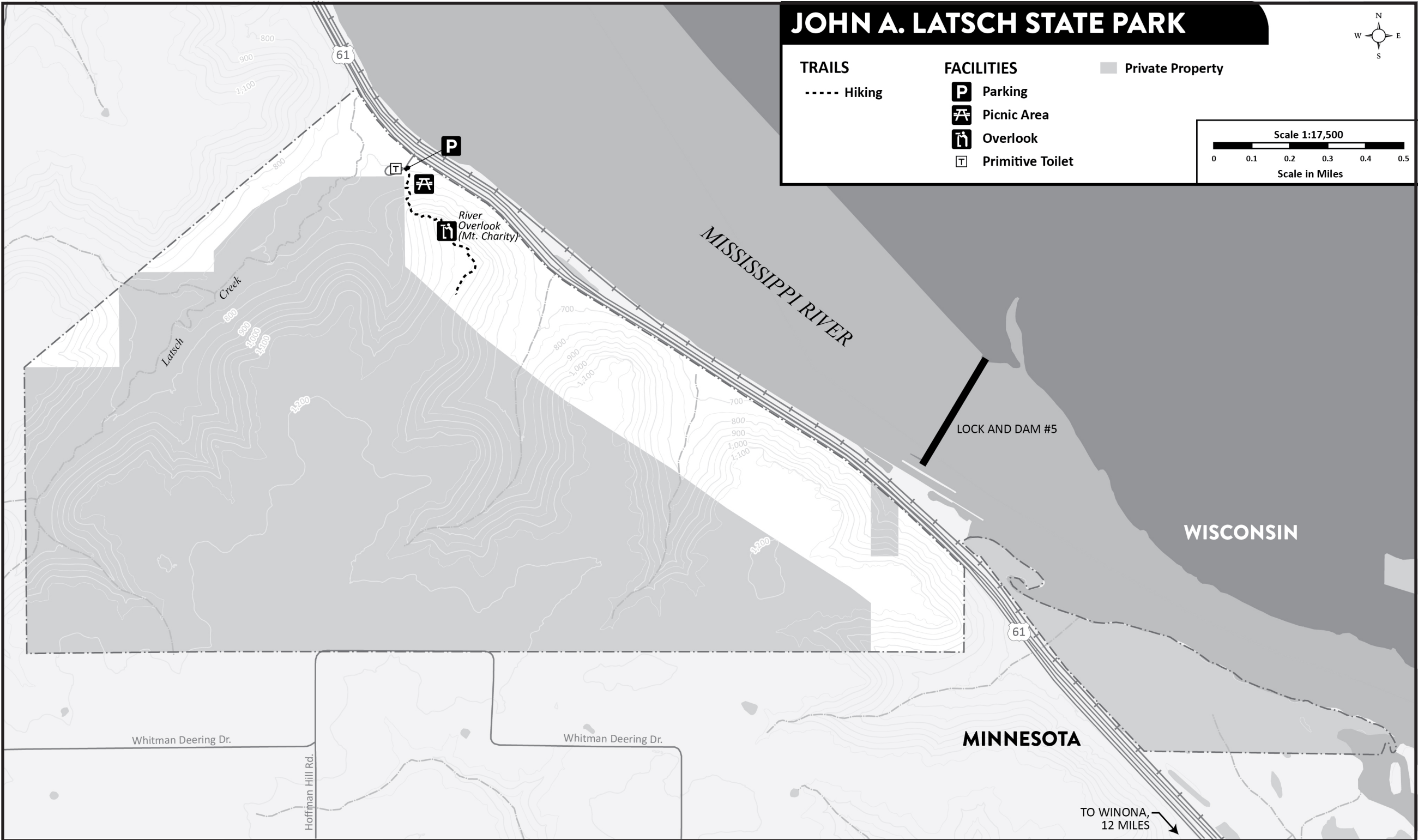

ABOUT THE PARK

Full of Mississippi River vistas, this park bears the name of the philanthropic Winona grocer who donated the land to the state in 1925. The park's convenient location and small footprint have made it a favorite stopping point for people traveling between La Crosse, Wisconsin and Red Wing, Minnesota. The park was once classified as a state scenic wayside and is unique in not requiring a state park permit today. The park's hiking trail was created by the Civilian Conservation Corps in 1933. Enjoy the beautiful views you will find there.

TRAIL HIGHLIGHTS

Riverview Trail

0.5 miles one-way

Steep terrain • Packed dirt • 300+ stairs

It is a workout to get to the top, but you will be rewarded with incredible vistas of the Mississippi River Valley, the Upper Mississippi Wildlife National Wildlife Refuge, and U.S. Lock and Dam Number 5.

Steamboat captains on the Mississippi River relied on the three rocky-headed bluffs called Faith, Hope, and Charity to navigate their way up and down the Mississippi River. The bluffs tower more than 500 feet above the river. This trail climbs Charity Bluff.

MORE TO EXPLORE

- Return in fall for stunning, colorful views.
- Watch for migrating birds in spring and fall.
- Enjoy a visitor center and naturalist-led programming at nearby Whitewater State Park.

PARK OPEN

8 a.m.–10 p.m. daily.

Must be purchased at this park or from vendors who sell wood approved for this park; no gathering firewood in the park.
