ABOUT THE PARK

Kilen Woods State Park was created in 1945 to preserve vanishing natural features in the Des Moines River Watershed. The beautiful Prairie Bush Clover Scientific and Natural Area is located within the park and protects the federally threatened prairie bush clover along with hundreds of prairie dependent plants, pollinators and wildlife. You'll also experience oak savanna and cool woodlands during your stay. Visit and immerse yourself in the park's unique habitats as you hike, camp, paddle or bird watch.

TRAIL HIGHLIGHTS

Sioux Trail (Hiking Club)

2.1-mile loop

Rolling hills • Mowed grass • Gravel

Hike this trail south from the parking area for linking trails with rolling hills and naturally occurring prairie. Find the Connector Trail to go through the Prairie Bush Clover Scientific and Natural Area to a lovely overlook above the Des Moines River. Just beyond, you'll see the Ox Cart Trail and an established oak savanna.

Meadow Trail

1-mile loop

Some hills • Packed dirt • Mowed grass

Hike here for a carpet of wildflowers in spring, cool shade in summer, and brilliant colors in fall.

MORE TO EXPLORE AT THE PARK

- Reserve the cozy chalet shelter or nearby amphitheater for your next big get-together by calling the office.
- Bring your own canoe or kayak and paddle the Des Moines River for a mix of quiet waters and class I rapids.
- Stay overnight at a drive-in campsite or walk-in campsite. A few sites are available for 1-3 month seasonal stays. Call 866-857-2757 or visit MNDNR.GOV/RESERVATIONS to reserve.

PARK OPEN

8 a.m.–10 p.m. daily.



VEHICLE PERMITS

Permits required; purchase at park office or entrance kiosk.



PETS WELCOME

Keep on 6-foot leash; pick up after; attend at all times; not allowed in buildings or at beaches.



CAMPGROUND QUIET HOURS

10 p.m.– 8 a.m.; only registered campers may be in campground during quiet hours.



FIREWOOD

Must be purchased at this park or from vendors who sell wood approved for this park; no gathering firewood in the park.
